Kress, J. H.--Cabin Building #311 Reccommended level of Treatment: Preservation Cost Estimate N/A Lat. 35° 31'13" Long. 83° 40'38"

This is a rectangular 24'x17' building with a 6' porch across the front. It is $1\frac{1}{2}$ stories, gable roof. The roof is covered with asbestos shingles.

The walls are split, hewn log. The corners are dove-tail notched, and all cracks between logs are unchinked. The gable ends of the building are board and batten.

The building rests on masonry piers.

Windows: There are a total of five windows in the cabin. stationary 6 light windows in the attic. In the north room there is a 4 over 4, single hung window, set in the north wall. There is also a 3 over 3 in the east wall of the same room. In the south room there is 6 over 6, single hung window in the east wall. All sash and components are manufactured.

Doors: There are three doors in the building. The main entrance is on the east side of the building, opening into an entry way. There is also a doorway in the north wall of the north room, and one in the west wall of the north room. The doors to the latter are missing. The main door is 4 panel wooden, with butt hinges. All locks and other hardware are missing.

Chimneys: There are no chimneys in the building.

Floors: "The floor of the north room is missing. The floor of the south room is 1"x8" sawn board. The floor of the porch and the upstairs room is random-width rough sawn lumber. The floor of the upper room over sawn joist forms the ceiling of the lower portion of the structure, while the upper story has no ceiling.

Interior Plan: There are two 12'x17' rooms downstairs. There is a stairway leading from the lower story beginning just inside the front door. It consists of nine steps made of pine board. There are no bannister or newell posts. Upstairs there is a full room in the attic. All interior walls are hewn log.

General Location: This is the only remaining building of the Kress complex. It is off Bone Valley Creek, and can be reached only by Jeep up a nine mile trail from Lake Fontana.

About the turn of the century, logging companies came to the mountains. They established huge mills and camps, and clear-cut vast amounts of country. There were several hundred people living in the Bone Valley vicinity, but the establishment of Great Smoky Mountains National Park, and the construction of Fontana Dam, with its huge lake, caused the area to be left by the inhabitants.

The area around Bone Valley, and its major water course, Hazel Creek, was characterized, as was much of the mountain area, by isolation. For generations contact with the outside world was limited, there was inbreeding, and much distilling and drinking of moonshine whiskey. Illiteracy was prevalent, and violence was common.

But for all its shortcomings, the area was one of generally self-reliant, independent people. They formed small farms, herded cattle on the high mountains, and, later, worked in the logging industry.

Today they are gone from this section of the mountains, and even where their descendants live in nearby communities, their way of life has disappeared.

Of the buildings that stood along the creeks of the southwestern edge of the park, the Kress Cabin alone remains in its immediate vicinity. It has survived in a fairly good shape, and although in need of repair, it exhibits some of the finest features of log construction to be found in the Smokies.
