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Fairview Plantation House, Ethel vicinity, East Feliciana Par
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Fairview Plantation House (c. 1830) is a frame "Carolina I" house with some Greek Revival features. It is located in the rolling wooded countryside of East Feliciana Parish. Despite some alterations and additions, the house retains its National Register eligibility.

The essential characteristics of the "Carolina I" house are as follows:

- 1) a height of two stories,
- 2) a core plan which is two rooms wide and one room deep on each floor. These rooms are sometimes divided by a central hall.
- 3) a shed roof one-story front gallery,
- 4) a one-story rear shed roof space open as a gallery or enclosed as rooms.
- 5) an end gable roof, and
- 6) end chimneys standing outside the walls.

All of these features are found in Fairview, where the front range of the lower floor contains a central hall which opens into the wider central portion of the rear range. This range has always been enclosed and subdivided into rooms, although the precise number of original rooms is unknown.

The home's simple Greek Revival woodwork consists of a subdivided front transom, a series of <u>faux bois</u> two-panel doors, and the treatment of two of the three original mantels. They feature plain pilasters which support an extremely wide entablature. One of these mantels is painted in the <u>faux marbe</u> manner. Other noteworthy features include a third original mantel similar to the other two but with an arched panel and a keystone applied to its entablature, a large elliptical arch with a keystone separating the central hall from the central portion of the rear range, a steep stairway rising toward the front from below the arch, and a paneled dado found throughout the original portions of the home.

Fairview has had a number of owners over the years, and several of them have made changes to the home. For descriptive purposes, these alterations are grouped by the owners who made them:

- 1) changes made by the Thompson family between 1883 and c. 1940:
  - a) the pre-1920 subdivision of the larger of the two upstairs rooms in order to add a closet and create a second floor central hall,

- b) the 1920s addition of a bedroom wing (later converted into a kitchen) on the west rear corner of the home, and
- c) the 1920s addition of a back porch to the house, which originally had no rear porch. This porch was a shallow shed roof appendage which connected the central rear door to the bedroom/kitchen wing.
- 2) a c. 1950 restoration and expansion by the Irwin family which accomplished the following:
  - a) the replacement of the 1920s rear porch with a deeper and wider gallery spanning the rear elevation of the original portion of the house,
  - b) the enlargement of the kitchen wing and the addition of a master bedroom wing on the east rear corner of the building. In order to provide access to the newer wing, a rear lower floor <u>cabinet</u>-like bedroom was subdivided and converted into a hallway and bath,
  - c) the replastering of the walls, the addition of a salvaged Colonial Revival mantel in one upstairs bedroom, the installation of a bath at one end of the upstairs hall, and the closing of all the downstairs chimneys except for the one in the kitchen, and
  - d) the reopening of the western end of the lower floor's rear range, which had been subdivided by the Thompson family to create a bath and hall. Two additional windows were added to the rear wall at the time of the reopening.
- 3) Changes made by the current owner, c. 1985:
  - a) the addition of a laundry room with space taken from the western end of the rear range and gallery, and the installation of shelves and bookcases on the western end of the rear range. This installation necessitated the removal of one of the windows on the rear wall.
  - b) the replication of one front gallery post, and
  - c) the addition of a closet in one upstairs bedroom and the closure of the upstairs chimneys.

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Despite these changes Fairview Plantation House retains its architectural integrity. Almost all of the alterations are located either at the rear of the home or upstairs. The facade looks exactly as it did in the nineteenth century, and the structure retains the essential characteristics of a "Carolina I" house as outlined above. As a rare example of this important house type, the Fairview Plantation House is a strong candidate for National Register listing.

#### Contributing Element

A two-room brick kitchen dependency with a metal roof stands directly behind the plantation house. It is being counted as a contributing element because it appears to be contemporary with the historic home.

#### Non-Contributing Element

A modern one-story frame shed also stands within the nominated area. It is being counted as a non-contributing element.

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Fairview Plantation House is significant at the state level in the area of architecture as a rare surviving Louisiana example of the "Carolina I" house type. These houses are significant as indicators of the migration of the planter and upper middle classes from South Carolina. As noted cultural geographer Dr. Fred Kniffen states in his article on folk housing: "Early in its movement southward the 'I' house became symbolic of economic attainment by agriculturists and remained so associated throughout the Upland South and its peripheral extensions." The SHPO is currently aware of only seven "Carolina I" houses that remain in Louisiana. Thus, Fairview Plantation House stands as a rare example of a substrain of the British vernacular architectural tradition in the state. In addition, because five of the surviving "I" houses are found in the Feliciana Parishes, Fairview Plantation House is an excellent representation of the distinctly Anglo-American (non-French) heritage for which that area is known.

#### Historical Note

The land upon which Fairview stands was first settled around 1811 by Benjamin Grubbs. Grubbs transferred the plantation in parcels to Ellis Gore and his wife in 1827, 1831 and 1836. In 1840 the Gores divorced and the plantation was purchased by cotton planter William East. The East family owned the property until 1883, then sold it to R. Emerson Thompson, Sr. R. E. Thompson sold it to Hezekiah Thompson that same year. Fairview remained in the Thompson's hands until c. 1940, when it was sold to George Gayden, a relative. About 1949 Gayden's daughter and son-in-law, Dr. and Mrs. William Kernan Irwin, purchased Fairview, which at that time was quite deteriorated. In addition to restoring the home, they commissioned noted Baton Rouge architect A. Hays Town to design the master bedroom wing. The current owner, Martha Yancey, is the niece of Mrs. Irwin, from whom she inherited the house in 1985. Ms. Yancey restored the home's original name of Fairview after it had been known as Lakeview for many years.


