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





A classic column replaces bearing partitions in the building's largest drawing room (24 feet by 49 feet). This room is in the apartment of publisher C. D. Jackson. Ceilings are 15½ feet high on the first floor diminishing to 12 feet on the eighth. Original detailing, such as the plaster ceiling (right) is in immaculate condition. Above, right, is a detail of one of the laminated sliding doors, showing an original glass insert.
