Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The house of the descendants of Ponce de León in San Germán is a two story residential building of rubble masonry walls with a cantilevered balcony at the second level running the full width of the facade. The street level has five doorways with direct access from the sidewalk, two on each side of the central, arched entranceway, which is of greater proportions and flanked by two pilasters similar to the ones that define the vertical limits of the street floor. The other 4 doorways are rectangular, capped by molded hoods. The street facade is extended to the right to incorporate an entry for the carriage. The balcony, originally of wood, was substituted by one of concrete and iron. The forked columns sustain a roof which extends below the cornice and parapet. The four louvered doorways are also capped by molded hoods.

The main entrance opens into a hallway that runs the full length of the house, giving access to the staircase on the right of its axis, other rooms on either side, and the rear patio. The stairs rise to a vestibule with archways opening to the living room towards the front and the dining room towards the rear. The space flows gracefully from the front balcony through the central axis, which in turn gives access to the bedrooms.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Alfredo Nazario - Alsina, 1954

According to local historian Aurelio Tió, before founding the original settlement San Juan, Don Juan Ponce de León (first colonial governor of Puerto Rico), was among the first inhabitants of San Germán, one of the oldest towns in Puerto Rico. The architecture of the town belongs mostly to that undatable local variation of the colonial style either in its commercial or residential manifestation, and the so-called colonial style proper, highly utilitarian masonry structures, provided with many doors to the street, meant to aid the commercial transactions to which this style was invariably dedicated. This architecture is not exclusive to San Germán, as it is present throughout the south of the island.

La Casa de los Ponce was most probably constructed in the middle of the XVIIth century, and altered in different periods. Information on the original builders is lacking.

We do know that Baron Capriles was in charge of the 1905 alterations and Alfredo Nazario Alsina in 1954. These alterations consisted of installation of a modern sanitary system, electrical wiring, repair of wood roofs and floor and steel reinforcement for the masonry walls after the 1918 earthquake, among others.

La Casa de los Ponce derives its significance from the fact that it was built by Ponce de Leon's direct descendants. It is possibly the oldest residence in continous use in San Germán.

It's most famous resident was poetess and educator Lola Rodríguez Ponce de León one of the most prolific of the XIXth century Latin American women poets. The bronze plaque on the facade reads:

> "In this house lived, until her marriage to publisher Bonocio Tió, Lola Rodríguez Ponce de León, born September 14, 1843 in San Germán died November 10, 1924 in Havana, Cuba. Poetess, Patriot, Educator. "Circulo de Recreo de San Germán, Instituto de Cultura Puertorriqueña".


In the library of this ancestral home are kept her letters and other writings, part of her furniture, paintings and other memorabilia. From this room the distinguished writer corresponded with the most notable personalities of the Hispanic American and European intellectual world. The writer's archives and library, of great cultural and historic value, and the house, of architectonic and sentimental relevance, are of considerable significance in Puerto Rico. Their conservation and habilitation as a museum, library and local archives, will undoubtedly enrich the cultural heritage of Puerto Rico.


