#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Prominently situated over-looking Johns Bay, the Emily Means House is a two story rectangular building of terra cotta tile construction. The exteriro is covered in a smooth stucco and the hipped roof has wide over-hanging eaves supported on exposed rafter ends. Extending across the south facade is an arcaded terrace. This round arched motif is repeated for the entrance vestibule on the north elevation. Designed in a Mediterranean villa style, the Means House is largely unaltered except for the east elevation where a row of three dining room windows have been replaced by a single picture window and a second story bathroom window was reduced in size. All other windows are original and contain small- paned lights.

The interior woodwork includes a staircase and mantelpiece in the Colonial Revival style. The moldings are quite simple and in keeping with the austere treatment of the exterior.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

1914

This rare example in Maine of a summer cottage in the Mediterranean style using stucco covered terra cotta tile is of further importance as the home of Emily Means who was nationally known as an authority in horticulture and who, on the island, maintained extensive rock gardens containing rare species of plants.

Miss Means purchased the island in 1900 but did not build her summer home there until 1914 although she began developing her gardens some years before. To design her unusual house, she retained the services of Samuel Very, an architect in New York City. Of passing interest is the fact that the well supplying the house was the first to be steam drilled in South Bristol.
