fine brick classical Federal house
with woodwork attributed to
Matthew Lowrey, having archways
and mantles with colonnettes, medallions,
gougework, reeding, fluting and
rope moldings; had tetrastyle

w ~~wooden~~ fan light and side lights;
Palladian windows in bays.

Remnants of the house remain
as well as the intact detached brick
kitchen, frame smoke house and
stone quarters.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A, 20 ft behind the stone quarters at the rock fence, thence N parallel to W end of quarters 200 ft to B, thence E parallel to N end of brick house ruins 150 ft to C, thence S at right angle to B-C 200 ft to D, thence W parallel to rear wall of quarters 150 ft to the beginning, containing the stone quarters, brick kitchen, frame smoke house, and ruins of brick house, about 1/2 acre.
