

18 continued: Two smaller dormers are windows. All dormers have shingle decoration in gable ends, bargeboards and decorative insets with pendants and finials. Five bay open front porch has turned posts on brick pedestals, corner fan and spindle and pendant trim. South facade has three bay open porch with machine cut trim; small porch at rear attached to shed addition. Gable dormers with bargeboards on side slopes of roof. Bargeboard along all gable ends and along cornice on all elevations. Interior end chimneys, modern asphalt roof.
