DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The First Christian Church is a large (82' x 82') biege pressed brick church in the neo-classical revival style. It is distinguished by a dome 28' in diameter and by its two similar facades fronting on 7th Avenue and 7th Street. The facades are three bays wide with an inset center bay dominated by four Ionic columns supporting a pedimented gable. All facade openings are round-arched and all facade windows have stained glass which came from Portland. The major window is located in the inset bay and is flanked on either side by a window similar to those in the other facade bays. The entry is also behind the columns and leads into the left bay.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The First Christian Church is architecturally significant as a good example of a neo-classical revival style building in Lewiston. Its imposing mass and dome make it one of the better churches in the state rendered in this style.

The church was erected during Reverend Ross's pastorate from plans of his former church in Milton, Oregon. The Milton church was designed by Pendleton, Oregon, architect Hatch who followed the original plans of a Walla Washington, architect named Semfow. Architect Taymond W. Hatch later designed the First Christian Church in Twin Falls following a similar plan only on a more modest scale and without the dome.

CHRISTIAN CHURCH LEWISTON

The 82 x 82 foot Christian Church dominates the corner of Seventh and Seventh in Lewiston. It is one of the largest and best executed buildings in the prestigious Normal Hill residential district of Lewiston. Its dome, one of the largest in Idaho, is the only one of its kind in Lewiston, and its Ionic columns are among the better classical details in Nez Perce county. The round arched stained glass windows exhibit good craftsmanship.

The neo-classical revival style was a popular style adapted by the Presbyterian and Christian churches in Idaho from 1916 through the 1920s. This building is perhaps the state's best example of the style. It is larger and more ornately finished than the Twin Falls Christian and Presbyterian churches (NR) and the Idaho Falls First Presbyterian church (NR), none of which required such an extensive elaboration of significance as was required for this nomination.
