7. Description

Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The parish church of Nuestra Señora del Carmen of Hatillo occupies a block to itself in the center of the town to the east of the plaza. It is oriented on an east-west axis, its entrance facing west. The building is enclosed by a concrete balustrade wall modulated by pillars. Metal grillwork gates close the entrances corresponding to the lateral doors of the building.

The building plan consists of a nave and two aisles; four arches resting on square pillars divide the space. There are five bays plus the apse/sacristies. The first bay or sotocoro comprises the vestibule, the baptistery on the right, and concrete stairs leading up to the choir loft on the left. The concrete choir loft is new. The original roof made of wood beams and layers of brick that covered the naves and apse sections was replaced with a flat concrete roof over the naves and a lanterned concrete dome over the square apse. Apart from these additions, the other noticeable modern elements are wood and plexiglass doors, aluminum louvered windows, and terrazo floors. The side facades are simple, each having three windows and one arched doorway. A second smaller door opens into the sacristy. A cornice runs the whole length of the building.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The parish church of Nuestra Señora del Carmen of Hatillo is of historical and architectural importance. The building was designed by Pedro A. Beibal in 1870, and the construction was finished in 1879, being one of the oldest buildings in the town of Hatillo. It retains most of its original construction and design elements; brick masonry walls, columns and arcades. No new construction has been attached to the outside of the main building, except for the tower added in 1930. The volume of the church can be appreciated from all angles. As is traditional in Puerto Rico, the plaza, church and city hall, have always been the center of town life. The historic relationship between these three urban elements has been maintained in Hatillo, and is a living example of the town planning characteristic of the Spanish colonial period in Puerto Rico.




