Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The white color of decorative bands, diamonds, cartouches, and window sills contrasts with the dark brown brick of this two-story school building in a vaguely gothic, early-twentieth century style. Projecting pavilions, each with a low peaked gable, break the broad low massing at the center and each end of the facade and at the centers of the end walls. The centered entrance pavilion on the facade rises above the parapet walls and is further distinguished by a segmentally-arched two-story recessed bay containing a broad rectangular upper window and a segmentally-arched recessed doorway. The square-headed windows are ranged in groups of four, with three groups on each side of the facade entrance and with one group on each side of the end wall entrances. The window openings have been filled with bronze-colored frames and glass in the 1980's.
