Description: Built ca. 1900, this one story frame dwelling is distinguished by its elaborate carpenter's ornamentation. A porch with rounded corners, turned balusters, and bracketed, turned posts has an elaborate spindle frieze. Two polygonal bays with gable roofs project from the house, behind the porch. A third gable is centered above the entrance. The facade, beneath the porch, is sheathed with diagonal beaded boards. The house has a brick pier foundation and a gable roof, sheathed in standing seam metal. The interior of the house continues the diagonal wall sheathing. The central hall is barrel vaulted, with the wall boarding continued through the ceiling.

Significance: The John Jacob Rawl House is distinctive for its carpenter's ornamentation.

The diagonal beaded boarding is unique to the area. The builder of the house,

J.J. Rawl, was prominent merchant and sawmill operator in Batesburg.
