Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Minnis McCampbell Barn is a two-story, double pen, log and frame cantilevered barn built ca. 1890. The barn was built in a rectangular plan with a central runway. The barn has a stone pier foundation and gable roof of metal standing seam. The first level consists of two hewn log pens with square notching. The second level is cantilevered approximately three feet over the lower level. On the second level is vertical board siding over the framing system. The interior framing displays mortise and tenon joints and pegged construction. On the northeast facade is an original frame open drive-thru shed with vertical board siding. The barn is located adjacent to an open field in a rural area adjacent to Tuckaleechee Cove.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Minnis McCampbell Barn is significant under criterion C as a representative example of a double pen cantilevered log barn. The barn is one of 126 double pen cantilevered log barns inventoried in the county and it is one of the best unaltered examples of its type. The barn is typical of its type with two log pens separated by a central runway and a frame upper level with vertical board siding. The barn has side facing gables and a roof ridge parallel to the front and rear of the structure. The barn continues to be used for hay and silage storage.

The McCampbell family settled this section at the mouth of Dry Valley in the mid-19th century. The family farmed several hundred acres and built several houses and barns by 1900. This double pen barn was built ca. 1890 to serve as livestock and hay storage. The barn was built in a cantilevered fashion which was common in the county. The barn continues to be used as a stock barn.





View: West and south facades. Photo # 1


