

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The A. O. Thomas house is situated in a residential neighborhood in Kearney (1970 pop. 19,350), one block south of Kearney State College. Constructed of concrete blocks, the house depicts the Neo-Classical style of architecture which gained popularity in Nebraska after 1900. Notable features of the house, which was originally unpainted, are the two-story Corinthian columns supporting the pedimented porch roof and the brackets which provide simple ornamentation under the eaves. The hipped roof, covered with wooden shingles, features flared eaves and is truncated on the main portion of the house. A gabled roof extends over the frontal porch. Dormer windows penetrate the roof on three sides. The full frontal porch (east facade) extends around the house along the north facade to a side door which originally was protected by a one story porch. The interior floor plan of the house is a modified four over four room situation with a two story rear wing.

A one story, two stall, modern garage is situated behind the house.

About 1915, the house was sold to Laura Elliot who began to rent out portions of the residence. The Harold W. Swan family purchased the property in 1932 and in 1954 restored the house to a single family dwelling. The building is presently being sold to the Kearney State College Alumni Association who wish to preserve the house and use it for office space, meetings and receptions.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Dr. A. O. Thomas was a very significant figure in the development of educational institutions in Nebraska. This house serves as a tangible reminder of Thomas, who did much to promote and encourage academic advancement in the State.

August 0. Thomas (1863-1935), an Illinois native, received his undergraduate education in western Iowa. After earning his Doctor of Philosophy degree, he migrated to Nebraska in 1891 to serve as principal of the Cambridge Public School in Furnas County. Thomas served 10 years in various public school systems in the State and then in 1901, he became Superintendent of the Kearney City Schools. While serving in this position, Thomas was elected the first president of the Kearney State Normal School, now Kearney State College.

The college was established in 1903 by an act of the Nebraska legislature. The city of Kearney then presented the school with 25 acres of land and construction soon began on an academic building. Classes commenced with a summer term in 1905.

Kearney State College was given excellent guidance in its formative years by Dr. A. O. Thomas. In 1906, the State Superintendent of Public Instruction reported that during Kearney College's first year, enrollment broke all records of previously established Normal Schools in the United States.

The Nebraska State Senate and House committees visited the school in 1911 and praised Thomas and his administration. The Senate committee reported that "the management and superintendency of this school is of such a high order and so much superior to many other places we visited that we feel it is our duty to compliment the officials in charge" the House Committee stated that "Mr. Thomas could well be set up as an example to some other state Superintendents." During Dr. Thomas' administration enrollment increased from 892 to 1430 students.

Thomas served as president of the college until 1914 when he became Nebraska's Superintendent of Public Instruction. In 1917, Dr. Thomas accepted a similar position in Maine. In 1923, Thomas was one of the founders of the World Federation of Education, now the World Confederation of the Teaching Profession.

The Kearney State College campus now includes a total of 28 buildings and the enrollment stands at over 5,000 students.

George A. Berlinghof (1862-1944), designer of the A. O. Thomas house, was a very prominent Nebraska architect of German nativity. He was educated at the Polytechnic School of Darmstadt in the 1870's. In 1881, he established his residence at Omaha and worked as a member of the prestigious architectural firm of Mendelssohn, Fisher and Lawrie. From 1898-1906, Berlinghof practiced architecture (see NRHP Beatrice City Library, Gage County) successfully on his own in Beatrice and then moved to Lincoln where in 1907 he was named State Architect. Berlinghof is responsible for the design of many state building projects, several academic structures throughout the State, including the original building at Kearney State College, courthouses in several states and numerous residences.

The A. O. Thomas house in Kearney was built in 1906 immediately after Berlinghof completed the first building on the Kearney State College campus. The house is an excellent and significant example of the Neo-Classical Revival Style of architecture.
