

(#10. Significance, continued)

In summary, the significance of this complex derives from its architecture as an excellent example of a locally prominent type. The South Branch Valley is said to have some of the best brick Greek Revival style architecture in the state. The house appears to have received relatively few alterations and this is a good example within this context. Secondly, the complex with its multiplicity of agricultural and domestic outbuildings is notable as a prosperous farm, farming being the major economic force in the South Branch Valley. Finally, on the local level, the association of this property with the prominent McNeill family is significant. The McNeills were prosperous land owners who during the Civil War were Confederate sympathizers, as were many families of the South Branch Valley. Members of the McNeill family and other confederates formed a group called "McNeill's Raiders" who sabotaged a number of Yankee troop movements in the area during the Civil War.
