has a simple G. R. feeling.

The dimensions indicate a single pile central passage plan, but it is now hall-parlor. A room was added on the N end, and a long addition spans the rear with its own horizontal gable, making a valley the length of the house. Attic not inspected for staves.

There is a 2 room log house with central chimney down hill behind the house, in very poor condition.

Owner said there is a date stone in the cellar

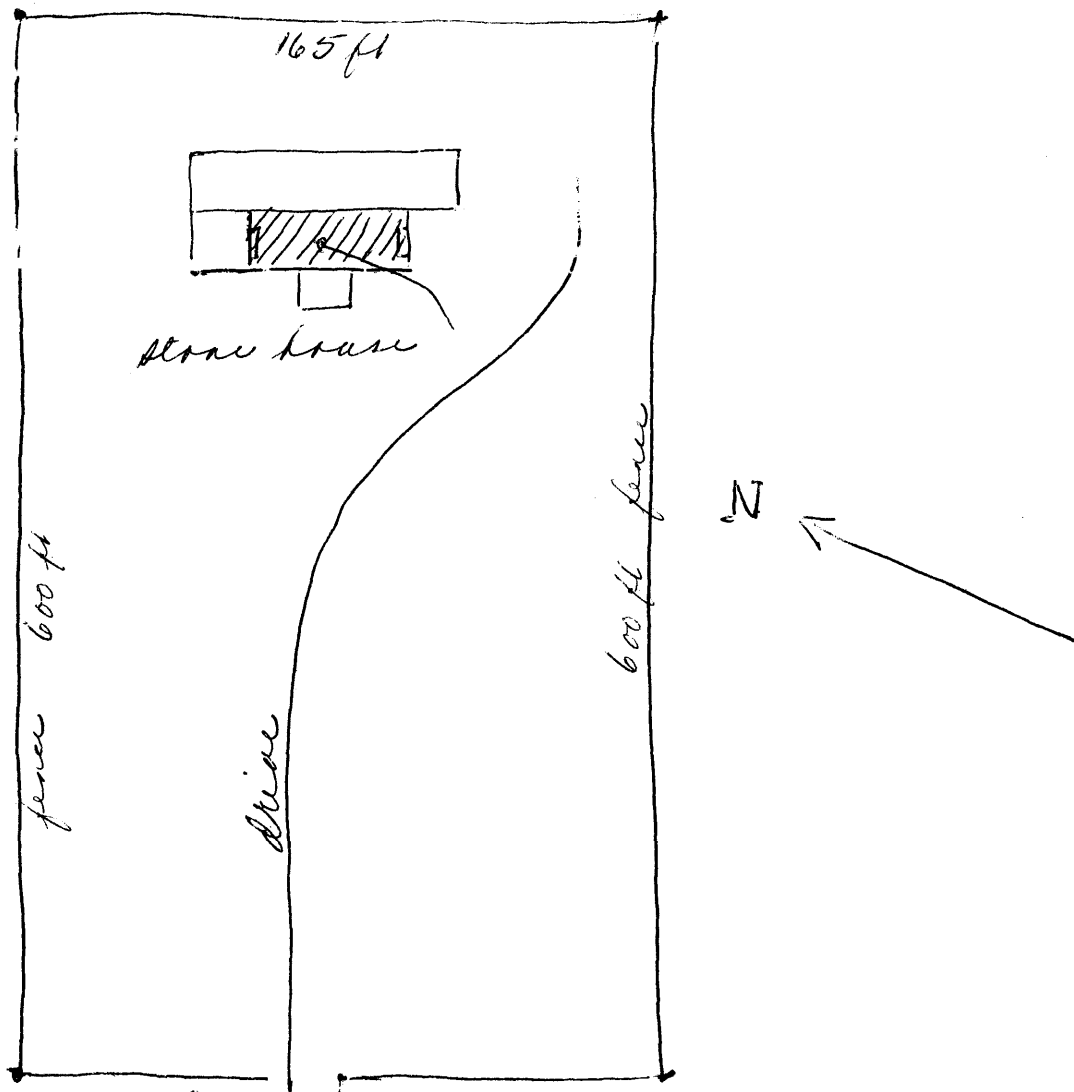

↳ the S of the stone house where the owner Hogan lived. His farm had 1-2 thousand acres. House burned c. 20 years ago. This informant (one of the Brown brothers then on Scotts Ferry Road) said his grandfather was ~~born~~ born in the log house. After the Hogans, Geo. Montgomery owned farm, lived in the stone house and added the wood part. After him, the Bonds lived there until purchased by Matt Jones father 40 years ago.

VERBAL BOUNDARY DESCRIPTION & JUSTIFICATION

Beginning at A at rd 33, thence with road N 165 ft to B, thence with fence around house 600 ft E to C, 165 ft S to D, and 600 ft W to the beginning, containing the house and lawn. The site contains 2.27 acres.
