The Bishop House is a significant example of the Queen Anne style in Dayton, characterized by sloping gable roof, engaged tower, porch with turned posts and spindle frieze, and a variety of ornamental wood siding. Bishop, an incorporator of the local light and power company, built the house probably in the 1880s and lived in it until 1895.

This lovely and well-maintained Queen Anne has a scenic setting on a large wooded lot on the banks of Patit Creek. The gables on the roof have full returns, with decorative shingle work in the gable, a shed dormer in one roof slope, and a shingled round turret. There is a cutaway corner and a small porch at the rear. The partial front porch has a spindlework frieze and turned porch supports with brackets. Windows are mostly double hung, one over one. The front door is original, a double door with glass upper and panels lower. The turret is covered with vertical wood v groove siding at the main floor.
