### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The complex is located to the northeast of the Cedron Community and consists of a small dam and two buildings located on opposite sides of Lost Creek.

The gristmill, located on the eastern side of the creek, is a two story structure, rectangular in shape and measuring 28' x 30. The exterior walls are board and batten and the structure rests on large piers of stone quarried from the creek bed. The second floor projects several inches and the gabled roof is covered with tin and topped with a small wooden cupola. A four foot wide ramp leads to the first floor entryway.

Interior divisions consisted of one room per floor; however, the second floor has been recently divided into several rooms. The milling apparatus, a De Loach product, is located on the first floor and is largely intact, as is the turbine.

The dam is constructed of native sandstone taken from the bed of the creek and is approximately 20 feet high, thirty feet long and four to six feet thick.

The sawmill is board and batten, and consists of a two story section with a long one story wing. Both sections are supported by stone piers and have tin gabled roofs with small cupolas. The one story wing housed the sawmill while the two story portion housed a cotton gin and corn feed crusher.

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Boshell's Mill is a small scale rural milling complex which dates from the late 19th century and consists of a sawmill, a gristmill and a mill dam. It is the only known saw and grist mill combination in northern Alabama.

The original sawmill was brought to the present site in 1885 by W. R. Boshell and was operated by steam until 1901 when it was converted into a water driven mill. During the early years the mill was used primarily for cutting railroad trestles for the Frisco Railroad, then being constructed.

During the 1890's the mill burned but was immediately rebuilt and at that time a cotton gin was added to the complex but its use was discontinued after the production of the first bale because of insufficient power.

In 1903 a grist mill was added to provide work for the sawmill workers during the slack periods of business. The first miller, George W. Boshell, a son of W. R. Boshell, operated the mill until his death in 1938. Work continued under the direction of Cecil K. Boshell. The mill closed in 1963 upon the retirement of the last miller, R. C. Jones.

The sawmill was operated by descendants of W. R. Boshell until 1961 when it ceased operating.

Both structures have been vacant since the 1960's and although structurally sound, are in a state of disrepair. There is considerable local interest in the restoration of the mills.
