DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Palmer House is a 1 1/2 story frame Classic Revival house with three broad and very tall bays. The foundation consists of brick piers; the first story is wood frame with the cornerboards treated to resemble rudimentary pilasters. The gable roof has a boxed cornice and returns. The dormers of the east (entrance) facade are not original. In each gable end is a single six over six double hung sash window. There are also six over six double hung sash windows on the first story elevations. Two brick chimneys break the ridge of the roof in-line with these first story windows. The interior plan is double pile, central hall.

On the entrance facade the central double door with glazed transom has unusual frame detailing of stepped lintel and central finial. The wood central entrance portico has three small bays, square (in section) posts and balustrade. Reflecting the posts on the facade of the house proper are simple pilasters. Both posts and pilasters have imposts. The cornice and frieze elements of the portico reflect those of the house itself but are abbreviated and probably indicate a later construction date for the portico. To the south and west of the house are service additions.

On the northwest corner of the Palmer House lot is a one room office now used as a shop. Its porches also appear to be of later construction and the building appears to have been moved closer to the house to permit road widening.² Otherwise it is essentially in its original location. The office is also frame, of one story, and has a pedimented gable on the Jefferson Street (east) facade.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Palmer House is an excellent example of a frame three bay Classic Revival house with double pile, central hall plan. This type of simple, straight-forward construction was dominant in North Florida throughout the 19th century.

The basic plan of the house was simply treated. Each of the four first floor rooms contains a fireplace, centered in the interior wall and common to the adjacent room.

On the exterior the Palmer House is also a stereotype of building style and technique of the 19th century. The wood frame house on brick piers might have adaptations of fenestration, ceiling and window height and entry details which would alter its superficial appearance; however, the essential configuration remains. The archetype also had a double pile, central hall plan with symmetrical fenestration and chimney placement, some form of classical detailing, and a gable roof with light or ventilation access for the second floor (either dormers or gable-end windows). The Palmer House conforms in all of these elements. While its porch and dormers might represent later alterations, similar details existed on the house in the 19th century.

In addition, a major outbuilding, a doctor's office, survives. However, the date of construction of the house and office cannot be documented due to undifferentiated Tax Rolls. The property has been owned by the Palmer family from its purchase by Thomas M. Palmer for \$500 in 1842, until its sale in 1961. The office was used by Dr. J. Dabney Palmer who resided in the house from the time of his marriage shortly after the Civil War until his death in 1909. Both the house and office may have been used by his parents, John M. and Margaret Palmer, the father having been the local druggist.


