STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Cornwall Bridge Railroad Station is located in a small town and is an important landmark to the people of the area. A basically attractive building, it is endangered through neglect. As is the case with many old transportation facilities, it is being allowed to deteroirate. The station is now unused—boarded up and abandoned. Passenger service ceased some itme ago and a freight train passes once a week without stopping.

Because the station is part of a rapidly vanishing "Americana", as well as an attractive building, artist Eric Sloane has begun procedure for acquiring and restoring the station. He would have it moved on the tracks the four or five miles south to the Sloane-Stanley Museum at Kent, as a part of the museum complex. Negotiation is underway with Penn Central and methods of moving the building on a flatcar are being investigated.
