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Summary

The Fishback School is a single story, wood frame classroom building designed in the Plain Traditional style with restrained Colonial Revival influences. The asphalt shingle hipped roof covers an essentially rectangular plan, the only interruption being the projecting, central front entrance bay. The weatherboarded walls are supported by a continuous concrete block foundation.

Elaboration

The Fishback School is a single story, wood frame classroom building designed in the Plain Traditional style with restrained Colonial Revival influences. This plan is essentially rectangular, as it is relieved only by the projecting, pedimented front entrance bay. The asphalt shingle hipped roof covers an essentially rectangular plan, the only interruption being the projecting, central front entrance bay. The weatherboarded walls are supported by a continuous concrete block foundation.

The eastern or front elevation is symmetrically-organized around the central entrance bay. The pediment of the entrance bay is filled with wood weatherboarding and a sloping asphalt shingle cornice just above the entrance. The transom of the entry below has been filled with narrow, flush planks, and the double-leaf entrance is accessed via a low set of concrete steps. The walls to either side of the central bay are each lighted with three nine-over-one sash windows. The western elevation opposite is also symmetrical. It is accessed via two symmetrically-placed, central, single-leaf entries and lighted with three fixed nine-pane wood windows to either side of the entries.

The northern and southern elevations are identical, as each is lighted with a central, nine-overone wood sash window.

Significant exterior details are limited to the pedimented front entrance bay and the tall, panelled friezeboard placed directly beneath the cornice.

The Fishback School has remained largely unaltered since its construction and is in good condition.

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Fishback School

Springdale, in the 1920's, was an important market center for the grapes, apples, vegetables and other produce cultivated on the farmlands and orchards of Washington and Benton counties. The construction of the Fishback School in 1925 reflects the growth of Springdale as a market hub, as well as the improvement in educational physical plants as a result of the McRae Administration.¹

The Fishback School, constructed during the period covered by the historic context *The Evolution of the Public School System in the Arkansas Ozarks*, 1920-1940, is a representative example of a small, wood frame school building constructed for a rural school district. Its use during this period as a local school building clearly identifies it with this historic context and with this property type. It is significant locally under Criterion A through its direct associations with the history of the evolution of the public school system in the Ozark Mountain region of the state during this period.




