Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Donaldsonville Historic District is comprised of about fifty blocks and has a mixed commercial - residential character. Its boundaries encompass 635 structures which date mainly from the period 1865 to 1933. The district is located at the former confluence of Bayou Lafourche and the Mississippi River, (The bayou is now dammed off.) Twenty-three percent of the buildings are classified as non-contributing elements; however, in the opinion of the State Historic Preservation Office, the district retains its historic character and hence its National Register eligibility.

Donaldsonville's development began in 1806 when William Donaldson hired Bartholemew Lafon to prepare a street plan for a town on his land. The plan had the usual speculative grid, but it also had a grand semicircular park and drive along the Mississippi and a rear avenue leading to a large public square. (These features, Crescent Park and Drive and Louisiana Square, are still extant.) Although Donaldsonville was enlarged through several annexations between 1846 and 1909, no other grand public spaces were introduced.

Much of the town was destroyed during the Civil War. In 1871 the New Orleans, Mobile and Chattanooga Railroad began regular service between Donaldsonville and New Orleans. The town completely redeveloped during the several decades after the Civil War and the main commercial emphasis shifted from the Crescent Park area to Railroad Avenue. The public market house once stood in Crescent Park, but today, except for part of the Lemann Store, the Crescent Park area has a largely residential character. The 1889 Romanesque Revival Ascension Parish Courthouse (Inventory #95) dominates Louisiana Square. Because the square is so large, the courthouse somewhat resembles a rural property at the head of a great park.

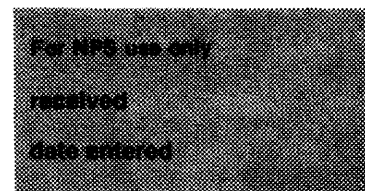
As previously mentioned, Railroad Avenue is now Donaldsonville's main commercial corridor. Unlike most of the rest of the district, Railroad Avenue has a two story scale for much of its length. This is mainly due to the familiar nineteenth century practice of placing living space above shops. Many of the commercial buildings have fixed awnings or galleries of some sort, although there is no consistent treatment. The commercial buildings along Railroad Avenue, and in ancillary areas, run the gamut from high style brick structures such as #131, an 1891 Romanesque Revival office building, to plain frame commercial structures such as #154. On the whole, Donaldsonville's grandest commercial buildings are located near the intersection of Railroad Avenue and Mississippi Street. Here the streetscape has a decidedly urban character.

The Railroad Avenue corridor is surrounded mainly by residential areas with a predominantly one story scale. Although the houses are set back from the streets, the lots are relatively small. As a result, the residential streets have a tightly packed character even where the houses are larger. As with many other South Louisiana communities, Donaldsonville does not have a unified pretentious residential area. Larger houses occur in isolated groupings or by themselves in a sea of bungalows, cottages, and shotgun houses. Scattered throughout Donaldsonville's residential neighborhoods are small frame stores, many of which are merely houses with applied shopfronts (see #102).

Aside from residences and commercial, governmental and educational buildings, the district contains a large Roman Catholic cemetery, smaller Protestant and Jewish cemeteries, and five churches. All of Donaldsonville's churches are in the Gothic style and all are locally impressive, but only the 1875-95 Ascension Roman Catholic Church (Inventory #36) is truly a landmark. It dominates much of the townscape and has the impressive presence of a cathedral.

Styles and Periods

Pre-1861 (23 elements--4%)

Very little survives in Donaldsonville from before the Civil War - mainly just a handful of small frame Creole cottages which are scattered throughout the district.

1861-90 (90 elements--14%)

For the most part, the buildings of this period are relatively plain cottages or simple late Greek Revival structures such as #64. In addition, there are some modest Italianate buildings (see #325). But there are also some exceptions to this such as the Romanesque Revival courthouse (#95) and the massive Italianate Lemann Store (#53 - National Register).

As the 1880's waned the Queen Anne Revival and the Eastlake styles made their appearance in Donaldsonville. A few large houses (#200 and #452) set the tone for much of the town's residential architecture of the next two decades.

1891-1910 (183 elements--29%)

Although relatively few large homes date from this period, numerous shotgun houses and cottages followed the lead of the larger houses in adopting Eastlake and Queen Anne Revival characteristics in profusion. Some, of course, were plain, but many were well styled with manufactured ornamentation. Commercial buildings showed a greater variety of architectural styles than they had in previous periods. One can find late examples of the Italianate false fronted style as well as Renaissance Revival, Romanesque Revival, and neo-classical in varying degrees of elaboration. In addition, numerous plain frame commercial buildings were constructed during this period.

1911-1933 (196 elements--30%)

The major contribution of this period to Donaldsonville was the bungalow. The style pervaded the last generations of shotgun houses and cottages as well as small commercial buildings. Again, very few large houses date from this period.

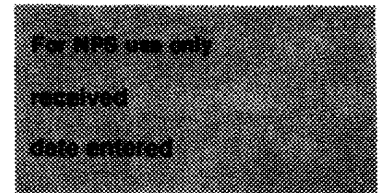
Intrusions (148 elements--23%)

Intrusions number some twenty-three percent of the district's overall building stock, a figure which is well within the normally acceptable range. In no case are the intrusions larger than the surrounding contributing elements. In fact, in most cases they are

smaller. Most of the residential intrusions are ranch houses (see #369) and are hence lower in profile than the neighboring contributing elements, most of which are raised at least two feet above grade. Similarly, most of the intrusions in the commercial area (see #179) are only one story high, while the contributing elements have parapets or false fronts which give them a higher profile than the neighboring intrusions. Intrusions are spread throughout the district and do not form a pocket in any one place. Hence the overall historic streetscape character is maintained.

House Types

Larger buildings in the district do not break down easily into definable types, but smaller ones do. There are ninety-nine Creole cottages in the district which represent the oldest of Donaldsonville's three major house types. Most are of two or four bays and most have some sort of front gallery. Unlike shotgun houses in New Orleans, most of Donaldsonville's shotgun houses are single rather than double. Of the 182 shotgun houses in the district, about a sixth have a side gallery. The ninety-four bungalows in the district are similar to those found in other towns across the state.

Contributing Elements

For purposes of this application, contributing elements are defined as pre-1934 structures which have not been altered beyond recognition. This broad scope in defining contributing elements was chosen because the district is significant as an overall ensemble of structures from various periods. Hence each period building contributes something to the total historic environment.

Assessment of Integrity

If a structure has been so altered that it no longer conveys much of its historic appearance, it is listed as a non-contributing element for purposes of this application. But a few contributing elements have undergone noteworthy changes. In the case of residences, this has generally taken the form of replaced porch columns, enclosed porches, or residing. As far as the State Historic Preservation Office can determine, less than fifteen contributing houses have been altered in one of these ways. In the case of commercial structures, many have lost their original shopfront glass but most retain their original shopfront fenestration and detailing. Only about ten do not. Given the above, it is fair to say that on the whole Donaldsonville's contributing elements retain their architectural integrity.

Donaldsonville's open public spaces, as previously described, survive intact. Both Crescent Park and Louisiana Square are still open and landscaped.

NB: There are 640 entries in the Donaldsonville historic district inventory; however, there are only 635 structures. The remaining five entries are cemeteries (3) and landscaping features (2). The cemeteries and landscaping features are included in the preceding breakdown by periods.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph) Criteria A and C

The Donaldsonville Historic District is of state significance in the area of architecture because it is the finest collection of structures from the pre-Civil War era to 1933 to be found in any of the Mississippi River parishes above New Orleans. Far from being unique, Donaldsonville is essentially similar in character to other old River Road communities; it is just more impressive. The district is also of state significance in the area of community planning because it incorporates formal planning features, which is unusual within the above context.

Donaldsonville is comparable to other Mississippi River towns in Louisiana in that it has a number of pretentious Queen Anne Revival and Eastlake residences and a number of Italianate commercial buildings, as well as some plainer frame commercial buildings. Like other older towns, Donaldsonville's patrimony mainly represents the period 1861 to 1933.

However, four factors set Donaldsonville apart from other Mississippi River towns and qualify it as a significant piece of urban geography:

First of all, Donaldsonville's historic area is unusually large and cohesive. It has 635 structures closely packed in a fifty block area with only twenty-three percent intrusions. This is something which no other Mississippi River town in Louisiana north of New Orleans can match. The sheer magnitude of Donaldsonville as a resource is impressive.

Secondly, Donaldsonville is unusual in that it retains a sizable complement of working class areas complete with housing (shotgun houses, cottages and bungalows) as well as neighborhood stores. Historic working class areas are often the targets of urban renewal efforts or have suffered considerable loss due to fire or abandonment. Donaldsonville's working class areas are well preserved with little alteration, and they are not significantly depleted. Moreover, they contain some fine examples of shotgun houses with elaborate Eastlake galleries both front and side. (Side galleries are unusual among shotgun houses.)

With 375 shotgun houses, bungalows and cottages in Donaldsonville, it appears that only Plaquemine is a serious rival as a center of working class architecture along the River Road north of New Orleans. It should be noted that, on the whole, Plaquemine's working class areas are somewhat later than those in Donaldsonville and are less ornamented.

Thirdly, Donaldsonville is noteworthy because of its fine collection of late-nineteenth and early-twentieth century commercial buildings. It possesses a broader range of commercial structures than is usually found in most Mississippi River towns north of New Orleans. In addition to the usual false front structures and provincial Italianate buildings, Donaldsonville also possesses several neo-classical buildings



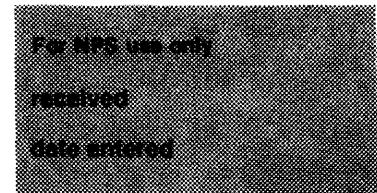

and 2 fine Romanesque Revival office buildings. Moreover, the Lemann Store (N.R.), with its cast-iron gallery, its three story sprawling mass, and its rich ornamentation, is probably the finest Italianate commercial building in any Mississippi River town in Louisiana north of New Orleans. The overall mixture of commercial structures yields a two story scale and a far more impressive urban style than is usually found in River Road towns.

Finally, Donaldsonville is one of only three Mississippi River towns in the state north of New Orleans which go beyond the normal speculative grid plan. Donaldsonville's plan incorporates Baroque features such as a semicircular park and an axial street leading to an open public square. St. Joseph and Beauregard Town in Baton Rouge are the other two towns which incorporate formal planning features. But St. Joseph's courthouse green is merely a large public square and hence is less sophisticated than Donaldsonville's plan, and although Beauregard Town's plan is more sophisticated, very little of it survives. Hence Donaldsonville probably represents the best example of formal town planning remaining in the Mississippi River parishes above New Orleans.

10. Boundary Description and Justification:

Description:

See map for precise boundaries. In most cases the boundary line follows either the center line of a particular street, the Mississippi River levee, or the bayou bank. Where it does not, it parallels an adjacent street, unless otherwise specified on the map.

Justification:

Because the district is significant as a tout ensemble of elements from the pre-Civil War era to and including the early 1930's, boundaries were drawn to encompass the collective mass of cultural resources. The district ends where the historic character plays out--i.e., where historic elements are no longer in the majority.

The three cemeteries (#s 294, 295, & 351) were included in the nominated area because they date from the antebellum period and are linked with Donaldsonville for most of the period of its history. In fact, they are older than most of the district's buildings. In addition, the largest of the cemeteries (Roman Catholic--#351) is architecturally significant in its own right. It contains numerous distinctive above ground tombs, one of which (#352) is individually listed on the Register. Moreover, it has an unusual Eastlake caretaker's cottage (#353).

The district is partially bounded by the Mississippi River levee and the edge of Bayou Lafourche, both of which are historic boundaries. Deviations from these two boundaries were made along Lafourche and Mississippi Streets to exclude peripheral groups of intrusions.

In other areas the district is bordered by areas of predominately less than fifty year old development. Although one would expect some historical development to have survived along the railroad, little remains in this area. The railroad corridor has become a major automobile route and hence has redeveloped.
