19. History The house was built in 1923 for R.C. Tway, president of R.C. Tway Coal Company. Architects were Nevin, Morgan and Wischmeyer, a prominent Louisville architectural firm. This firm also designed the Georgian Revival building for the Pendennis Club and the Colonial Revival Schuster Building, both in Louisville.		31. 20. Significance The Tway House is architecturally significant as an example of Georgian Revival architecture in Jefferson County.
