Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

This three-story rectangular building is constructed of brick. Granite is used for details such as belt courses and window trim, while the roofs and cornices are made of metal. The southwest facade of this Italian Renaissance style building forms the principal elevation and is fourteen bays long. Twin stair towers with round arched entrances and hipped roofs capped by ornate finials are the main decorative features. An over-hanging cornice, a frieze embossed with swags and three panels with floral designs ornament the upper section of each tower.

In the center of this elevation are six bays deliniated at the second and third story levels by round arched arcading. A cornice, with the name of the school in the frieze, provides a strong visual link between the flanking towers. For the three bays at either end of this facade, and for the two sides of the building, more restrained Renaissance details are employed. Included are brick quoins and a smaller cornice. In addition, above each entrance on the two ends of the school is a large Florentine window.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Jordan School of 1902 by the well-known Maine architect, William R. Miller is a distinguished design statement in Italian Renaissance style and is also important in the educational history of the City of Lewiston.

William R. Miller of Auburn and later Portland executed a number of extremely important commissions in Maine. Among these are the L. C. Bates Museum at the Hinckley School and the Lawrence Free Library in Fairfield, both listed on the National REgister. He also designed the famous Casco Castle resort hotel in Freeport, now gone.

The building, when built, served as Lewiston's first consolidated high school, replacing the outdated district school system, and remained so until it was replaced in 1931 by a new facility. It then became the junior high school and remained as such until 1983. The building facilitated the secondary education of most of the City of Lewiston's population including its mayors, councilmen, and such other prominent people as the former Governor of Maine, James B. Longley. The building is clearly an important landmark in the city.
