DESCRIPTION (Continued)

2 story masonry dwelling, 4 bays wide by 3 bays deep, with pitched roof. A single chimney mass remains of the original 2. Fenestration is symmetrical with 12 x 1 sash in a simple frame. Each bay has a flat arch and cut-stone sill. The entry is slightly off-centered and has a paneled door with fan-light, under a pedimented entry porch. Porch has attenuated columns and cut-stone block stoop. Attached to the rear of the house is a 2 story ell with pitched roof and south side porch.

SIGNIFICANCE

Example of a handsome early 19th century dwelling with much of its original integrity intact. House is a Federal style ensemble, complete with flat arch window-heads, and a door with fanlight. There are very few of these pure Federal period houses in the Town. Compare with 208 Broad Street which has gable-end to the street.

This house was built by Edward Moore in 1806. Later, in the mid 19th century, C.C. and J.R. Capen owned the house.

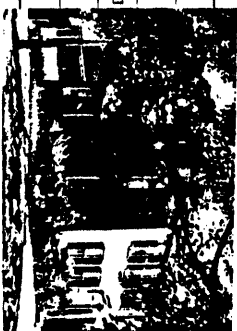
