7. Description:

The Junction City Municipal Building (BO-101) is located on the south side of Shelby Street on a corner block. Constructed c. 1939 by the Works Progress Administration, the municipal building (a contributing building) is the only resource nominated in this nomination.

1.) The municipal building (contributing building) is a two-part commercial block of brick construction. The flat roofline features a brick parapet with a string course work. The front (north) facade has 5 bays. A slightly projecting pavilion on the first floor central entry has a jack arch and quoins in brick. Front entries are glass and wood, some topped with a transom. Typical windows are 6/6 sash with brick sills, with the window heads having a string course. A carved, inset stone runner, located above the first floor central entry says "US Post Office, Junction City, KY 1939." Additional features include an interior end brick chimney and a continuous concrete foundation. Two mid-twentieth century additions include a one-story, three bay, brick addition (the city fire station) extending from the east wall with a flat roof, two large sliding garage doors and one entry door; and a one-story shed addition extending from the rear (south) wall with shed roof and two side entries.

8. Statement of Significance:

Located on a corner block on the south side of Shelby Street in Junction City, Kentucky, the Junction City Municipal Building (BO-101) is locally significant under Criterion A as an example of local construction techniques used by local builders working for the Works Progress Administration (WPA) in Boyle County (Junction City Clerk, 1997). Constructed in 1939 (the building's period of significance), the building was initially a post office in the small railroad town. The building contributes to the local understanding of the types of resources built by local workers of the WPA within Boyle County.

The property is nominated as part of the Multiple Property Listing "Historic and Architectural Resources in Boyle County, Kentucky" under the theme of "Political Buildings in Boyle County, 1917-1945." The town lot the building sits on was purchased by the Town of Junction City, a municipal corporation in November 1938 "...for the purpose of erecting a city building" (Boyle County Deed Book 67: 203). The ownership of the land and subsequent building by the town, a public corporation, was a prerequisite to receive funding from the New Deal agency. A placard along the entry of the building indicates the date of construction of the building and the financial support of the federal agency:

Currently, the building remains in ownership by the town of Junction City and is used as a municipal building, housing city hall offices. A mid-twentieth century addition to the east wall by the town houses the local fire department. The building meets registration requirements set forth in the MPL through its association with the WPA and its retention of original setting, location, function, plan, materials and craftsmanshib.

10. Geographical Data:

Verbal Boundary Description:

The Junction City Municipal Building (BO-101) sits on the southeast corner of Shelby and Lucas Streets in the railroad community of Junction City in south-central Boyle County. The nominated building is the only resource on the commercial block identified as Parcel 11 of the accompanying Boyle County Property Identification Map J5. The tax map is located in the Boyle County Property Valuation Office and has a scale of 1" = 600'.

Boundary Justification:

The boundary of the nominated property includes the remaining commercial building histaically associated with the lot.


