19. History While the house is associated with James B. Montgomery, a son of David Montgomery (See Gn-52), it is doubtful Montgomery built the house as he first acquired property there in 1853 from the Fiers heirs. James B. owned from c. 1853-1890 when he sold to R. W. Montgomery.			
20. Significance Architecture: the house is one of the best examples in the county of Federal architecture. A unique facade for the hall-parlor plan with two front (OVER)

18. Description:

Two-story; 5 bay; Flemish bond with jack arches; exterior end chimneys; 6/9 windows; circle-in-square motif in transoms; modillion cornice with applied decorative trim (original); ell addition; hall-parlor plan; two open corner stairs; eccentric mantel with overmantel in E room; porch possibly original or slightly later (20th c. brick bases to posts).

20. Significance (cont.):

doors; excellent detail work in transoms and woodwork separate this house from any other Federal structure in the county.

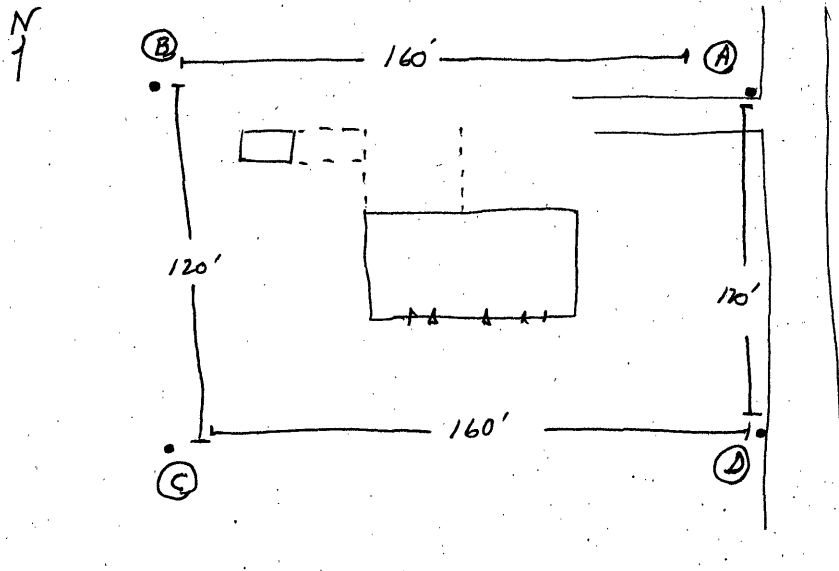

Verbal Boundary Description

Acreage @ .45 ACRES

Beginning at point A, the intersection of the driveway and the county road on the NE corner of said intersection, 80' from the NE corner of the Montgomery house; thence W on a line 30' distant from and parallel to the northern edge of said house 160' to point B; thence S on a line 30' distant from and parallel to the western edge of said house 120' to point C; thence E on a line 30' distant from and parallel to the southern edge of said house 160' to point D on the western edge of the previously mentioned county road; thence N along the western edge of said road 120' to the beginning. The boundary includes no significant outbuildings, but defined only the obviously used domestic house space.
