### DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

J. C. Tate General Merchandise Store consists of two frame and clapboard buildings located in Belfast, a small community five miles southeast of Lewisburg, the county seat of Marshall County. The buildings will be one hundred years old on June 29, 1978, and the business has operated continuously during this period.

The two-story store building was built on stone piers, and the space under the sills has been filled in with sheet metal. The low gable roof is covered with galvanized steel roofing and has a single brick stove flue on the ridge. Except for the installatio of plate glass display windows, the facade (east elevation) has remained largely unchanged; this is the most distinctive feature of the building. The three-bay, three-tiered facade has two cornices and a recently added small porch roof; each of these elements has delicately jig-sawn, paired brackets and ornamental mouldings. Four pilasters clearly delineate the bays and emphasize the vertical lines of the facade. The centered entrance still retains its headlights. Neither the north nor the south elevations have doors or windows. The rear (west) wall has four windows and a centered door.

The warehouse is located a few feet south of the store. Although simpler in style, it complements its companion building. The story-and-a-half warehouse also has a gable roof with galvanized steel roofing. The cut stone foundation piers have unusual capstones which served as a form of rodent protection for this building which was used for the storage of meat, seed, grain, and hardware. The two-tiered, three bay facade (east elevation) has remained unchanged. It retains its original double-leaf panel doors and window shutters. (The owner states that the store also had similar doors and windows when it was erected.) A large sliding door is centered in the south wall, and the north wall has no apertures. A door and shuttered window are found in the west wall.

The interior of the store has board walls and ceilings and hardwood floors. Many of the original counters and cases remain, but the most distinctive feature of the interior is the merchandise shelves; these are original and have heavy cornices and pilasters which duplicate those found on the facade.

### STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Williams (d. 1840) opened the first store in Marshall County in 1808. He purchased his merchandise in Nashville and hauled it by horse cart to the store. Later (ca. 1830) Robert Williams, his son, relocated the business in Belfast, an area formerly called The Crossroads, at the junction of the Columbia-Shelbyville and Nashville-Huntsville roads. The younger Williams served as the community's first postmaster. With the coming of the railroad, the town was moved closer to the rail line, near the intersection of US 431 and Fishing Ford Road. In 1878 Robert Williams built the store and warehouse. Mr. and Mrs. Ed Tate now own and operate the store; he is the great-grandson of Williams Williams. Five generations of the same family have owned the business and three of these have operated the store in the present building. This is the oldest commercial building in the Belfast area and the oldest business in the county.

Over the years the store has stocked patent medicines; food and yard goods; agricultural implements, supplies, and seed; and coffin handles. Farmers sold their turkeys and feathers, country butter, and animal pelts, and could obtain crop loans here. The town's post office was for many years located in the building, and it has occasionally been a polling place. According to the present owners, whiskey was not sold; this may have been because of the family's religious beliefs. The store is still a viable enterprise. The present owners sell food, ready-made clothing, shoes, towels, notions, greeting cards, and stationery supplies. If the Tates do not have the merchandise that the customer wants, they will order it.

The building has changed little during the century it has operated. Large display windows replaced the original shuttered windows in ca. 1930, and a small porch roof has been added. The major elements in the interior remain. Mr. and Mrs. Tate intend to continue operating the store. Its present condition is ample evidence of the care taken by the family to maintain the building.

Store buildings customarily are utilitarian in style and construction. J. C. Tate General Merchandise Store is a notable exception to this precept. Robert Williams engaged craftsmen to erect a fine new store building which was worthy of a new town in which the railroad stopped. Bracketed cornices and pilasters rarely appear on small town, frame commercial buildings in the state. The store has been and continues to be a landmark in this little Middle Tennessee community.
