

 The following covered bridges are county owned property under the jurisdiction of the Parke County Park Board:



- 5. Joe Woody (privately owned); Tangier Road; Bloomingdale, Ind. 47832 Bridge No. 27 is located on land owned by the Joe Woody family.
 - 6. Lee Alan Bryant Health Care Facility, Inc., R.R. 1; Rockville, Ind. 37872

 Bridge No. 1 is located on land owned by the Lee Alan Bryant Health
 Care Facility, Inc., and is under their care.

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
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- #27 J. H. Russell Bridge - 1 span, 42' in length, built in 1897 by P. Weaver. Queen Post construction. Located on private property. Taken out of service in 1970.
 - #28 Jackson Bridge - 1 span, 207' in length, built in 1861 by J. J. Danjels. Crosses Sugar Creek. Double Burr Arch construction. This is the longest single-span bridge in Parke County. In county road system. Repair of floor system runners, floor boards, swag bracing, and floor beams and repair of abutments in 1977.
 - #29 Marshall Bridge - 1 span, 56' in length, built in 1917 by J. A. Britton. Crosses Rush Creek. Burr Arch construction. In county road system. Floor beams and flooring repaired in 1977.
- #30 Rush Creek Bridge - 1 span, 77' in length, built in 1904 by Wm. Hendricks. Crosses Rush Creek. Burr Arch construction. In county road system. Floor beams and flooring repaired in 1977.
 - #31 Mill Creek Bridge - 1 span, 92' in length, built in 1907 by D. M. Brown. Crosses Mill Creek. Burr Arch construction. In county road system. Floor beams and flooring repaired in 1977.
 - #32 Bowsher Ford Bridge - 1 span, 72' in length, built in 1915 by Eugene Britton. Crosses Mill Creek. Burr Arch construction. In county road system. Floor beams and flooring repaired in 1977.
 - Coal Creek Bridge 1 span, 170' in length, built in 1869 by J. J. Daniels. #33 Crosses Coal Creek at Lodi. Burr Arch construction. In county road system. Flooring repaired and floor beams replaced in 1977.
 - #35 Wilkins Mill Bridge - 1 span, 102' in length, built in 1906 by Wm. Hendricks. Crosses Sugar Mill Creek. Burr Arch construction. In county road system. Flooring repaired and floor beams replaced in 1977.
 - Cox Ford Bridge 1 span, 176' in length, built in 1913 by J. A. Britton. #36 Crosses Sugar Creek. Burr Arch construction. In county road system. Flooring repaired and floor beams replaced in 1977.
