


The present configuration of the Passmore House was achieved through the construction of two sections at different time periods. The west side was built first as a two-story structure with one room on each floor. The section containing the hall and the east side of the residence was built circa 1830. The entire front brick facade was laid in Flemish bond. There are interior chimneys in the gable ends and a boxed cornice. Windows in the east section are six over six on the second floor and nine over six on the first floor. The original pedimented portico has been removed and repleed with a shed-roofed structure. A one story shed-roofed porch has been added to the rear facade.


