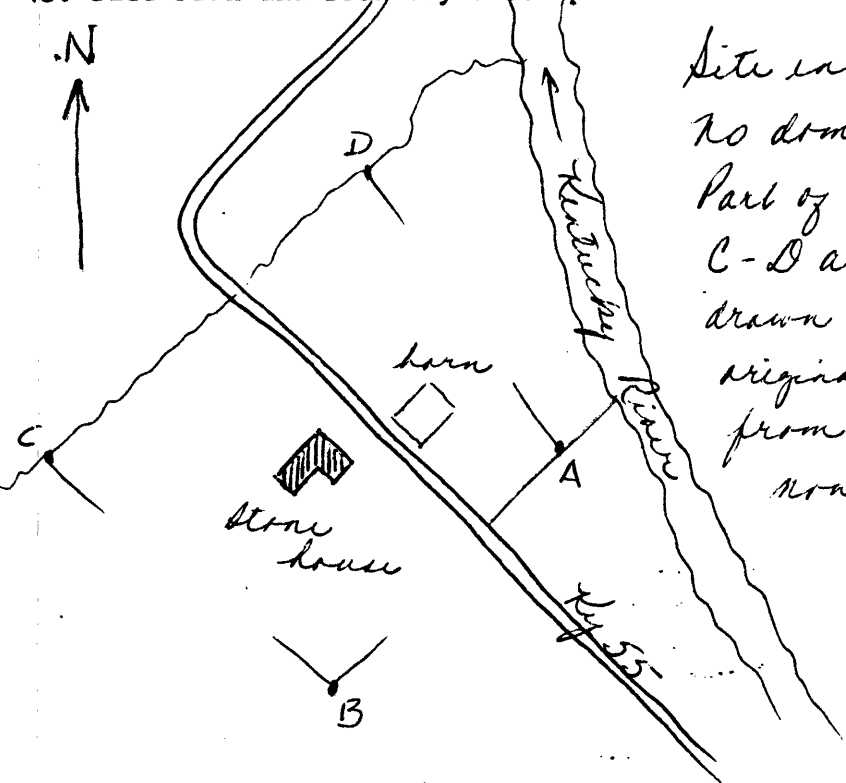

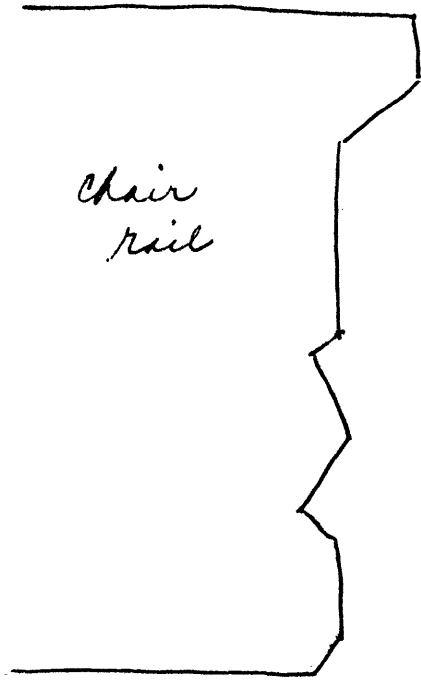
Site enclosed by A-B-C-D as shown

44. Description and House Plan:

Five bay, two story, central passage, dry stone house, ca. 22 X 46, with two story, two bay ell all built at the same time. Interior chimneys each gable end flanked by square attic windows. Tooled masonry, best at corners, mortar flat, has some concrete like CL-8 and HY-NC-71. Wooden lintels, medium width mitered corner frames, square sills. Had one story flat roofed Greek Revival porch (now fallen).

Center passage hall has open U stair, dropped newells, closed stringer. Four panel doors and frames are Greek Revival, 7" wide baseboard. Very late chair rail (see drawing) (mostly cut off). Victorian woodwork in ell and Victorian newell. Mantel with full columns.

Concrete block addition on rear of ell is a 20th century kitchen. It is not in harmony with the rest of the house, but it cannot be seen from the front.
