<u>Description</u> The Charlton Rauch House, constructed ca. 1886, is a two-and-one-half-story, weatherboarded frame vernacular Queen Anne style house with an irregular plan and a gable roof. A one-story wing is attached to the rear. Features of the house include a one-story, hip-roofed porch surmounted by a second-story, shed-roofed porch on the facade, a two-story polygonal bay with a tent roof on the left of the facade, and a hip-roofed, three-story, projecting polygonal bay on the right elevation with a recessed porch on the third story. All roofs are covered with pressed-metal shingles. The porches are ornamented with sawn friezes and balustrades and turned posts with sawn brackets. Windows are six-over-six.

Significance A locally important example of the Queen Anne style, the Charlton Rauch House was designed and built for Charlton Rauch by Frank Smithdeal, who also designed the W. Pickens Roof House. Rauch operated a livery stable on North Lake Drive on the site of the WPA Community Hall and was a cotton buyer and dealer in general merchandise. 64
