21.	This house was the home of Amelia Bloomer, temperance advocate, newspaper editor, women's rights leader and exponent of women's dress reform. Bloomers lived in the house for Computer interedictely following their marriage and them It is also reputed to have been a stop on the underground railway. Seneca Falls was the terminus of the Tear Underground Railway. The original structure appears to be a 15 story Greek Revival residence on a cut limestone foundation. The 2-story Italianate structure (ca 1850) was built by the Latham Brothers, a well-known local family of builders, architects and contactors (see National Register Nomination Form for the SACKETT HISTORIC DISTRICT, Seneca Falls, NY). This house was also the home of Obadiah B. Latham, sources: 1820-1872, an architect of the Capitol at Albany, NY
