DAVENPORT JAIL
The Davenport Jail was built in 1914 and is one of the best examples of the Prairie School style of architecture. It was designed by the architect, Frank Lloyd Wright, and is a fine example of his work. The jail is a two-story building with a flat roof and a central entrance. The windows are small and square, and the doors are made of dark wood. The building is surrounded by a low wall and a concrete walkway leads to the entrance.
