The Garfield Park Branch of the Santa Cruz Library exemplifies the application of Classical Revival and a variety of other elements to a very small building, stucco, one story over a low foundation. A gable roof slopes to the front and rear, with parapet gable ends. The gable roof is extended slightly over the central entrance. Above, a small pediment fits like a gablet. Below, a small classical entrance with fluted, tapered columns supports the entablature. The entrance frames a vestibule, beyond which is a wide wood-framed glass double door, flanked by panels, also glazed. On either side of the entrance are wide windows, a central wider section between narrow double hung windows, all under a transom with clathri design. On the left end there is an outside chimney between wide windows. Careful details are evident throughout: clathri on the wooden door panels; trim at windows and gable ends; exposed rafters under the eaves and their integration into the triptych pattern of the entablature; small diagonal brick pattern inserted on the chimney, and vertical row of bricks to create a courseline; interior woodwork and fireplace. A door has been added in the rear for a wheelchair ramp which crosses behind the building, but a few feet away and seeming apart from it. Also, stair hand rails have been added and window boxes removed. With these exceptions, the building is unaltered and its integrity has been well maintained. The size and style of the building are compatible with surrounding residences, but its classicism and park-like grounds convey dignity and public purpose.

The Garfield Park Branch Library meets the registration requirements set forth in the Multiple Property nomination, California's Carnegie Libraries.

The City of Santa Cruz received a total of \$29,000 in Carnegie funds, \$20,000 for the main library and, later, \$3000 for each of three branches. All four buildings were designed by W.H. Weeks: the 1904 Romanesque Santa Cruz Main was his first Carnegie library commission and the 1921 Craftsman Santa Cruz East Side was his last. Neither remains today. In between he designed two small Santa Cruz branch buildings which are still standing, Garfield Park and Seabright.

Garfield Park still serves its neighborhood as a library, although in the aftermath of Proposition 13 tax-cutting, it was temporarily closed, re-opening only after an organized petition campaign by the Westside Neighbors Organization. The neighborhood had first exerted its energy to acquire a library in 1907, and in 1908 a trial library was started in a room built especially for it at the firehouse. Carnegie funding for branches was obtained in November 1913. After some controversy about the site, a 60'x100' lot was donated and the adjoining 40'x100' lot purchased. Weeks' plans were approved and the lowest bid was \$2615. The building opened in March, 1915.

Much subsequent work on the building, from roof repair to landscaping, has been accomplished by the Garfield Improvement Club. A 1982 "Good Times" article cited the Garfield branch for its willingness to augment its small but solid book collection to meet patrons' needs, as well as for its "homey atmosphere which is conducive to reading."

While the library continues to be significant to the community today, the period of significance has been ended at 1942, fifty years ago, because exceptional significance has not been established.
