ARCHITECTURE

STATEMENT

This large house is a good example of late Queen Anne architecture in Davenport. Its rambling plan features a corner entrance tower, full-height polygonal bay, and assorted gabled pavilions with short cornice returns. The original clapboarding remains, providing the requisite surface textures commonly associated with the style. The polygonal porch is a noteworthy feature, despite inappropriate posts.
