AMENDMENT Grand Forks Near Southside Historic District (Increase) Grand Forks County, North Dakota

This amendment is being submitted to add the house at 1216 Belmont Road, which is within the established boundaries but was not surveyed, to the Grand Forks Near Southside Historic District.

Section 7: Narrative Description

The house at 1216 Belmont Road (SITS # 32GF3469) is an excellent example of the American Foursquare style, including an enclosed porch representative of the common adaptation to the cold climate of Grand Forks. The narrow lap (wood)-sided, presumably wood-framed square house features a hipped roof covered in asphalt shingles punctuated by a chimney at the roof peak and a shed-roofed roof dormer with 7 fixed lights. The windows are 1:1 wood sash and the foundation is concrete. The house maintains integrity of setting, location, materials, workmanship, design, feeling, and association.

Section 8: Statement of Significance

The house at 1216 Belmont Road is located within the boundary of the Grand Forks Near Southside Historic District and meets the criteria for significance established in the district nomination. It was apparently overlooked in the

District and meets the criteria for significance established in the district nomination. It was apparently overlooked in the survey. Its construction, in 1913 in the middle of the Second Dakota Boom, is indicative of the expansion of the city to the south as a result of the rapid growth of the West that followed the federal Homestead legislation and the arrival of the Great Northern and Northern Pacific railroads (criterion A). Grand Forks was a jumping-off point for homesteaders and a hub for merchandise to be delivered to western North Dakota and southern Manitoba. The district nomination states, "The neighborhood also represents the diffusion of national architecture styles and their adaptation to local culture and climatic conditions (criterion C) [section 8, first paragraph]....The consistent presentation of American Foursquare design and design elements is a defining characteristic of the Near Southside neighborhood, particularly in the southwest quadrant" (section 7, page 5). The house at 1216 Belmont Road is an excellent example of the style and contributes to the significance of the district.
