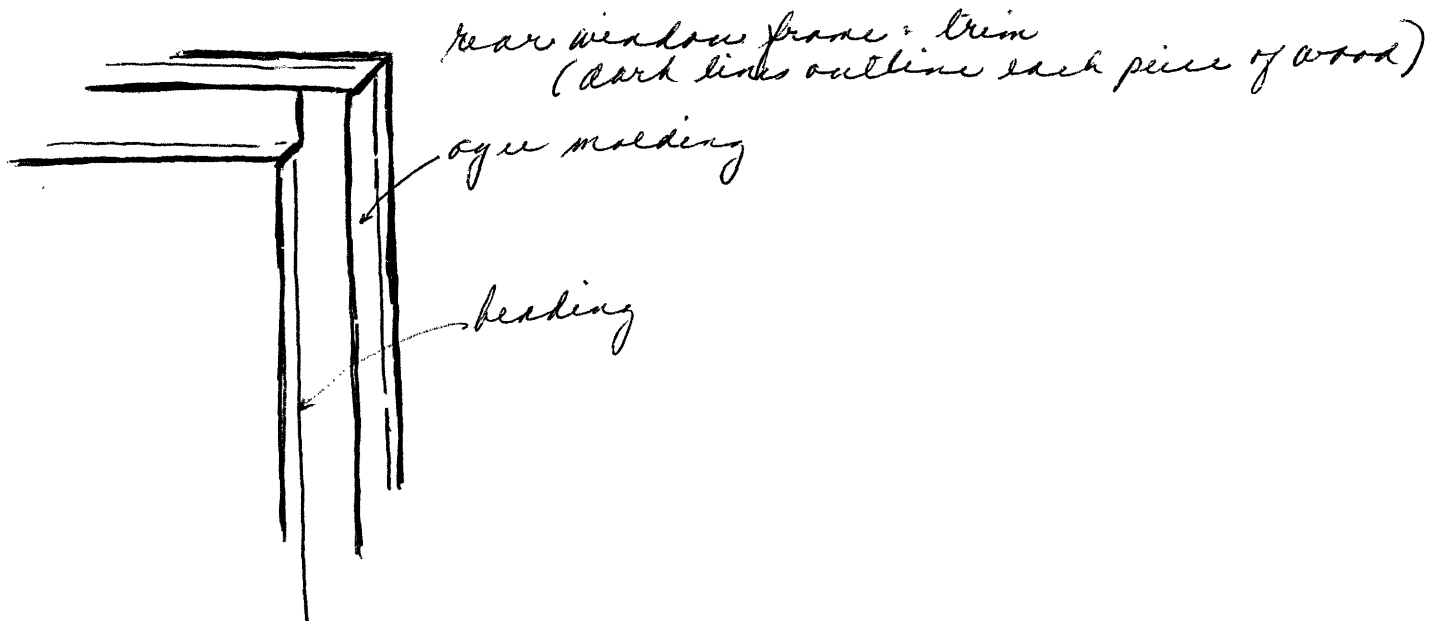

Chair rail around entire 1st floor; (photo 8)  
Chair rail upstairs; wood wainscoting in  
center hall; looking fireplace in rear  
kitchen has iron crane; frame "dog trot"  
room has chair rail also, stone foundation.  
West cellar has vertical opening, <sup>with loopholes</sup> angled (photo 3, 11)  
wide on inside to admit more light (a feature  
of stone barns in Pennsylvania), little pain;  
(photo 4) Rare corbelled stone cornice. Minor  
changes include porch gable heightened at  
steep angle to make bedroom over porch,  
rear hall divided into 2 rooms, matching  
left side of house, and front door and some  
windows frames replaced with concrete.

A mill stone is used to hold the door  
pole on the barn. Site of mill not located.

Beginning at A, thence E 108 ft <sup>with fence</sup> to B, thence with fence S 190 ft to C, thence W 108 ft to D, thence N D fence corner and with fence to A; containing the stone house, well, walk to drive. No other original buildings remain. About 1/2 acre
