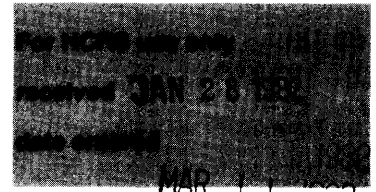

### **Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance**

#### The Context:

The Roseland Terrace Historic District is a 3 by 6 block area located approximately 1 mile east of the original town of Baton Rouge, which at the turn-of-the-century extended only a few blocks in from the Mississippi River levee. In fact, Roseland Terrace was considered by many at the time as being "just too far out." Although it began in 1911 as a separate entity, it is now part of a more or less continuous grid of mixed commercial/residential development which stretches from the Mississippi River to the east for approximately 5 miles. Beyond that, suburban development extends an additional 10 miles to date. At present development is continuing eastward at a rapid pace.

Roseland Terrace is relatively well-defined because it is faced on all sides by newer development. The district itself is residential in character and dates from between 1911 and 1930. To the west is an area of mixed residential and commercial development most of which is post-1930. To the east is Drehr Place, which is, generally speaking, characterized by more prestigious, largely 1930's and '40's residential development. To the south is a residential area characterized by medium sized 1930's, '40's, and '50's development. This area also contains a municipal park. To the north is an area of mixed residential/commercial development most of which is post-1930.

#### The Boundary Justification:

Of course, all of the above surrounding areas have at least a scattering of houses similar to those in Roseland Terrace (i.e., bungalows). However, none of them have a significant concentration of bungalows in comparison to the historic district. Although Roseland Terrace is loosely defined by the concentration of bungalows, the precise district boundaries are determined by the historic boundaries of the Roseland Terrace tract as developed and marketed by the Zadok Realty Company in 1911. (See map.)

#### The Overall Character:

The district consists of 346 structures and has a 12% intrusion rate. The overwhelming majority of the contributing buildings are either bungalows or 2 story structures "built along bungalow lines." However, there is also a smattering of 1920's eclectic residences as well as a handful of Queen Anne influenced houses which predate the bungalows (buildings #s 11 & 252 and general view #3).

Park Boulevard (formerly Golden Rod Avenue) and Cherokee Street are the district's two major thoroughfares. Both have neutral grounds and lines of live oak trees (general views 2 & 14).

The most pretentious residences are located along Park Boulevard and Camelia Avenue. Bungalows along these two streets tend to be slightly larger than those found along the other streets. In addition, most of the larger, eclectic, non-bungalow residences are set along Park and Camelia. Residences of this type are either loosely neo-Georgian or medieval style. A few are 50 years old and have been listed as contributing elements (building #337). This is because they are part of the early-twentieth century theme of the district. Most, however, are 30 to 40 years

old and have been listed as intrusions (buildings #s 95 & 295 and general view #11).

Lots are 40 feet wide and 120 feet deep. In most cases the bungalows are 30 feet wide and occupy a single lot. This yields a 1 story gabled streetscape with the houses set approximately 10 feet apart (general view #4).

Most of the houses have some sort of rear shed or garage. These are reached via a network of back alleyways which run through the interior of the blocks (general view #10). The alleys are about 8 feet wide and covered with gravel. A few of the garages (less than 10) have quarters above. Most are simple, 1 story affairs and some are mere carports.

The Houses:

The houses in Roseland Terrace were dated and catalogued primarily through the use of Sanborn Insurance Maps, which were available for the years 1916 and 1923. The breakdown by period is as follows:

1911-1916	15 structures	4%
1917-1923	155 structures	45%
1924-1930	132 structures	39%
intrusions	43 structures	12%

The earliest houses reflect the Queen Anne-Colonial Revival influence of the late-nineteenth century. These houses have features such as small fluted columns, curved galleries, semioctagonal bays, and relatively elaborate rooflines (buildings #s 11 & 252 and general view #3). One (the Reiley-Reeves House, building #252\*) has a corner turret.

Building in Roseland Terrace underwent a boom between about 1917 and 1930. During this period large numbers of bungalows were constructed by builders using standard designs and different combinations of standard details. The basic bungalow is a raised, pitched roof, frame structure, 2 rooms wide and 3 rooms deep. The plan is hall-less and has wide openings between the public rooms. In all but a few cases there is some sort of front porch. Some have half porches (general views #s 8 & 19) and some have full porches (general views #s 4, 9, & 22).

Larger bungalows have features such as:

1. an extra room in front, yielding an "L" shaped plan (building #255),
2. an extra 1 or 2 rooms on the rear,
3. a finished garret with pent dormers (building #14), and
4. a camelback (building #300).

There are also a few 2 story residences with bungalow details (general view #18). In some cases these were built as duplex apartments.

Despite the similarity of plans, the builders achieved a remarkable variety of exterior treatments by using different combinations of standard elements. (See buildings #s 33, 105, & 244, all of which have essentially the same plan but different facades.)

Typical architectural elements include:

1. exposed rafter ends (some shaped),
2. heavy splayed porch posts of various sizes (some of which are doubled),
3. large brackets and multiple brackets,
4. combinations of shallow gables,
5. large plate glass windows grouped in twos or threes,
6. hip and shed dormers (many of which serve no function),
7. wooden strapwork (found mainly on post capitals),
8. jerkinhead gables, and
9. oriental looking balustrades and extended beam ends.

Less common are Colonial Revival arches and columns (buildings #s 244 & 255). A few of the bungalows also feature mock half-timbering (building #52).

In contrast to the tract house tradition of most of Roseland Terrace, a few of the bungalows appear to have been custom built. These include buildings #s 69, 193, and 291 and general views #s 1, 9, 13, and 21.

Intrusions:

In addition to the 5 large post-1930 eclectic houses, there are two other major types of intrusions in the district. One is a type of vaguely medieval looking tract house which dates from the 1930's and '40's (building #129). The other is a type of modern, slab on grade ranch house with a small front designed to fit the old narrow lots (building #90). In discussing intrusions it must be noted that of the 43 post-1930 houses in the district all but 5, generally speaking, are small and fit perfectly into the geometry of the bungalow streetscape.

**Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)**

Criteria A and C

The Roseland Terrace Historic District is significant in the area of architecture as an example of an early-twentieth century residential neighborhood. It retains 88% of its pre-1930 housing stock. Moreover, with close to 300 well developed bungalows in a concentrated area, Roseland Terrace is one of the best preserved early-twentieth century neighborhoods in Louisiana outside of New Orleans. The overwhelming majority of the structures in the district exemplify the classic bungalow style. These houses are characterized by broad openness, elaborate transfer of weight, massing that hugs the ground, and the bold expression of structural members. Because of this, Roseland Terrace is an excellent representation of the bungalow period, which is an important chapter in the history of American domestic architecture.

Roseland Terrace is also significant in the area of community planning. It was Baton Rouge's first subdivision, and as such it began a trend in suburban growth which has come to characterize the sprawling city. It is also a fine representative example of the type of early-twentieth century bedroom suburb which sprang up around major eastern cities in the early-twentieth century. These were designed to give working men in the cities a more rural domestic life. Roseland Terrace exemplifies the early-twentieth century "garden suburb" with its small lots, liberal planting of trees along streets, and rear alleyways. In addition, it is finer than most because utility poles were deliberately placed (and are still located) along the rear alleyways. Thus the bucolic atmosphere is preserved and enhanced. Roseland Terrace was Baton Rouge's first planned subdivision as well as its most significant reflection of the ideas and concepts which ultimately led to the Garden City Movement.

## HISTORICAL SKETCH:

Baton Rouge's first subdivision, Roseland Terrace, was "staked out" in 1911 by the Zadok Realty Company, which had bought the land in 1910 for the sum of \$50,000. Extant photographs reveal that prior to this time the area had been a racetrack and had a decidedly rural character. The fence surrounding the track was covered with wild Cherokee roses. Stories are told that people warned Zadok Realty that the lots would never sell because they were too far out in the country.

A citywide contest was held to name the development, and the winning entry was Roseland Terrace, in honor of the Cherokee roses in the area. To continue this theme, the streets were given flower names. As has been mentioned elsewhere, the Zadok Realty Company made a deliberate effort to preserve and enhance the bucolic nature of the area by, for example, planting trees and hiding the telephone poles in the back alleyways. The company's ads boasted that there would be no telephone poles in the streets, but instead that they would be placed in the alleyways behind the residences so that everyone would be spared from "an unsightly conglomeration of poles and wires." Another ad guaranteed prospective buyers freedom from "a century's haphazard, careless growth."

8. Statement of Significance (Continued)

Zadok Realty Company's promotional campaign was obviously successful because after two years they had sold 408 lots at prices ranging from \$150-\$500. As can be seen in the extant houses in the district, Roseland Terrace hit its peak of popularity in the late teens and the 1920's. By around 1930 development was virtually complete.

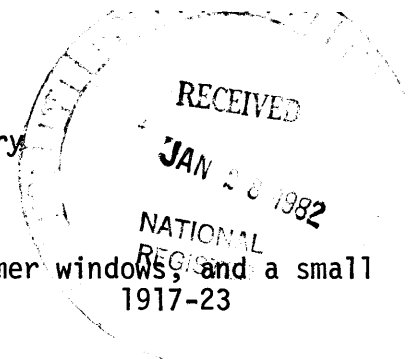

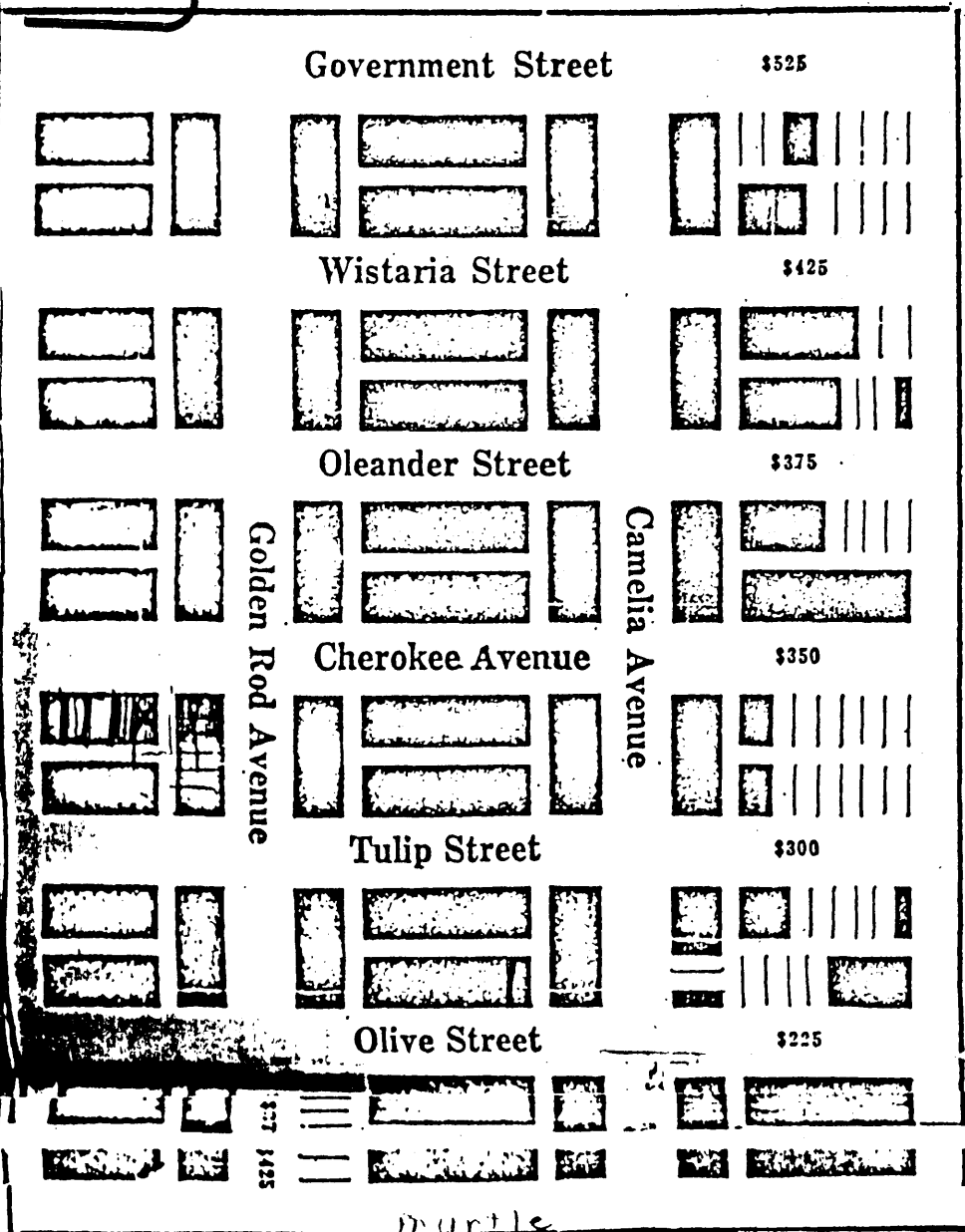

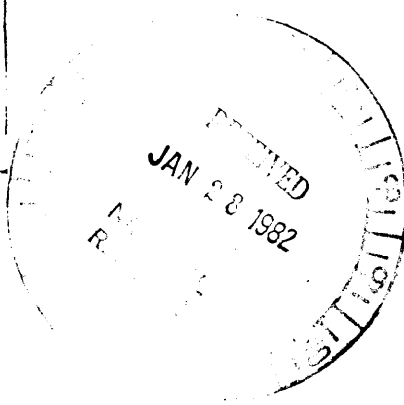
