DESCRIPTION:

The Herman Ojala homestead cabin, constructed of hewn logs, measures twelve-by-twenty-feet. This one-room structure exhibits an unusual feature in that the entire lengthwise walls extend three feet on the south end, creating a shelter for firewood. A door has been cut in the south end. The cabin has log gables, and although boards have been nailed over these, the boards are falling down. The roof is still partially covered with shake shingles.

SIGNIFICANCE:

This cabin is of historical importance as it was probably constructed around 1902. Mr. Ojala received the patent for his homestead in 1907, and thus had to have taken possession of the land at least five years earlier. It is, therefore, an early example of the Finnish style of log construction, with hewn and fitted log walls; moreover, it exhibits a unique feature in that its walls have been extended past the south end to provide a kind of windbreak porch or shelter for supplies near the door. It is definitely a unique structure, and although it is inaccessible by road and surrounded by aspen trees, thus being difficult to see from a distance, these circumstances have in fact attributed to its remaining in relatively good condition, as it has not been disturbed.
