

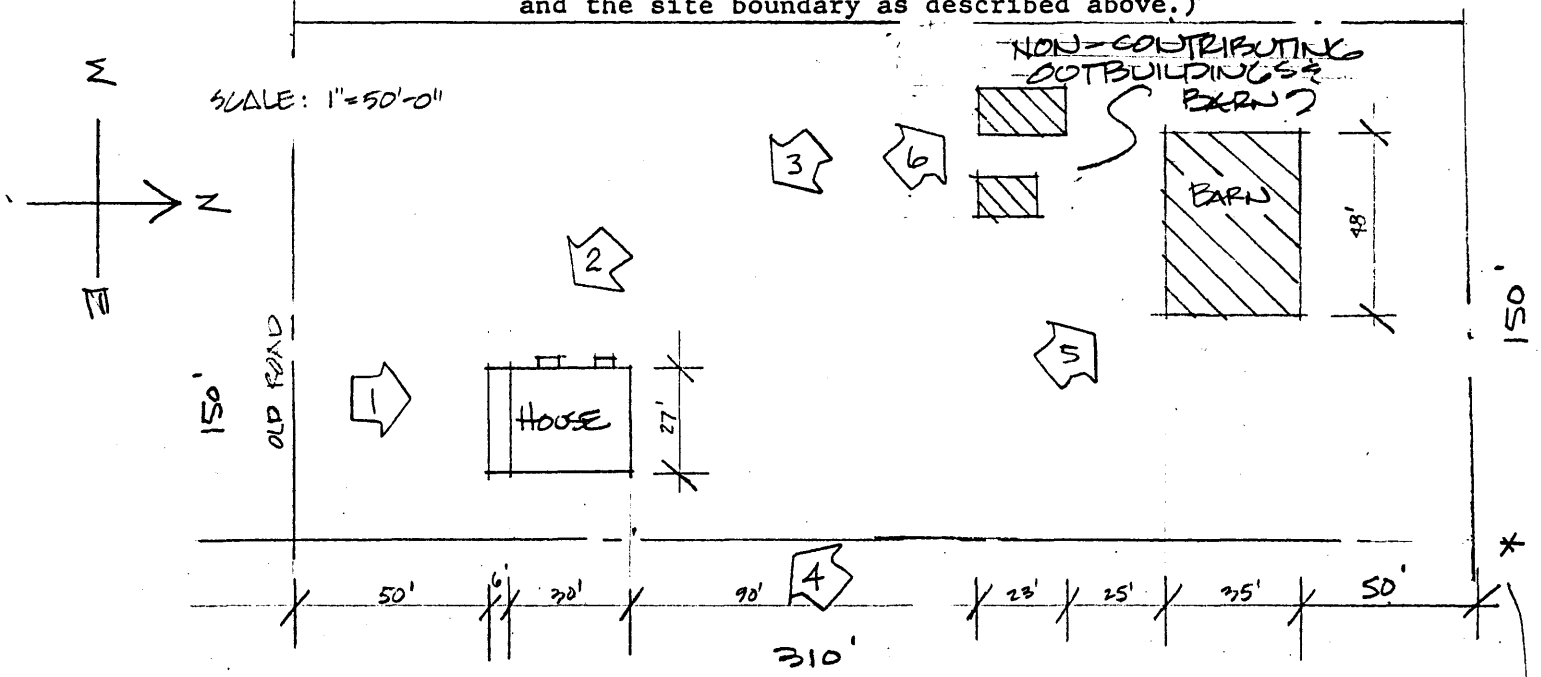

Verbal Boundary Description _____ Acreage 1.067

Beginning at a point 2800 feet west of the intersection of Asa's Creek Road and KY 825, then 310 feet south to a point; then west 150 feet to a point; then north 310 feet to a point; then east 150 feet to the point of beginning.

The boundary includes all of the domestic space associated with the house and one contributing building and two non-contributing structures which are log barns.
