18. pane with jack arches and the main entrance is enhanced by a twelve pane fanlight with semi-circular arch. Interior and exterior gable-end chimneys with two quarter gable windows of 13-pane on each side set off the main block which rests on a limestone foundation. A four window dormer further accentuates the facade, and cornice with returns complete the structure. A unique architectural feature is the double window placement with two-pane sidelights and accented by an intricate Peacock fanlight with semi-circular arch found on the ell. A tile roof manufactured by the Murray Tile Company of Cloverport covers the structure. Behind the house is a single-story brick smokehouse done in common bond, and a one and one-half story frame barn.
