


STATEMENT

This house is a good example of a distinctive 19th century Davenport house type, here constructed of wood. It displays the simplicity of form characteristic of the type, and original features such as gable-end oculus, molded window heads, and a double-leaf door w/recessed, round arched panels. The veranda, with its half-timberwork pediment, postdates the house by several decades, but is not elaborate enough to detract from the basic house form.
