(Originally both the "quoins" and the "rusticated" base were of a different brick color than the remaining wall surfaces.) All of the facade openings have prominent keystones. The entrance is emphasized by a triumphal arch motif, created by the large round arch doorway and smaller, flanking round headed windows. There is a string course which separates the third and attic floors and the attic level is decorated by modified medallions placed at the same intervals as the windows below.

## Statement of Significance

Designed in 1904 by Sanders and Gibb, the YMCA Building is an example of Renaissance Revival architecture. Although the structure has been greatly altered, it is historically significant on both a state and local level. Its site was the original location of the territorial capitol and the building itself was the first YMCA facility constructed in Arkansas. Its current occupant, the Arkansas Democrat, is one of two Arkansas newspapers with statewide circulation. The Democrat was founded as the Arkansas Evening Star circa 1871, and since that time has made a significant contribution to Arkansas history in the areas of journalism and communitations. The Democrat is the second oldest newspaper in the state and its owner and editor from 1878-1902, Professor James Mitchell, was recognized as the states's most influential journalist.
