Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Morgan City City Hall and Courthouse is located one block back from the industrial waterfront in the city's central business district. It is a 2 story rectangular hip roofed building laid up in common bond brick.

Victorian Renaissance Revival features include:

- (1) shallow brick 2 story pilasters dividing the north and west facades into bays.
- (2) the corbelled brick entablature panels.
- (3) the 2 square bracketed rooftop campaniles located in the centers of the north and west facades. The one on the north facade is open while the one on the west facade contains a clock and round arch windows.
- (4) the pairs of shallow arched windows in many of the bays.

The building is entered on the west (short) side through a large hall, with a double staircase leading to the old ballroom/courtroom upstairs. Originally this room had a stage, but this has been enclosed for office space.

In the 1920's 3 transomed side lighted entrance doorways were installed on the north (long) facade along with a Doric colonnade on the north and west facades. The doorways still exist, but the entrance area itself has been divided into offices.

Originally the three east bays of the north facade had iron doors with fire engine stalls. Much of this area has been divided into offices. The center bay still has a police car stall.

The original council chamber is still intact with elaborate pressed tin ornamentation.

Criteria C and A

The Morgan City City Hall and Courthouse is significant in the area of architecture as a landmark in the city's central business area. It is probably the largest building in the area, is handsomely detailed, and its two rooftop campaniles are visible for many blocks. It stands today as the visual centerpiece of the Morgan City Central Business District. In addition, of the city's 50+ year old buildings in the downtown area the city hall is easily the most pretentious. It stands as an independent hip roof block which is 3 bays deep and 7 bays wide and has 2 rooftop campaniles. Other buildings in the area are 1 or 2 story, false front, party wall commercial structures.

The Morgan City City Hall and Courthouse is significant in the area of politics/government because since its construction it has served as the seat of municipal government and the hub of political activity in the city.
