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### Description

The Methodist Episcopal Church in Bald Knob is a tall, single story, wood frame English Revival structure faced with buff brick. Its gable roof reveals its fundamentally rectangular plan. It is entered via three side gable entries and one end gable entry. The roof material is red tile and the foundation is continuous, cast concrete.

The eastern or main elevation of the church is composed of a pair of side-gable entries flanking three stained glass wall dormers. The southern entrance is sheltered by a large gable roof porch, which is decorated with wood trusses in the gable and supported on square, solid wood columns with chamfered corners set into a low, concrete porch and stairway. The three wall dormers are lighted with a pair of tall, leaded, stained glass windows beneath a transom window, and the northern recessed entrance features a single, ten-pane door accessed by a low stairway flanked by brick stoops.

The northern wall is punctuated by a tall, rectangular, louvered vent in the gable peak, a single six-over-one wood sash window placed toward the eastern wall and an entry to the west. The gable pediment is decorated with geometric and sawn, decorative half-timbering and stucco. The southern elevation features the same rectangular vent in the gable peak and the same half-timbering; however, a wood oriole window filled with five leaded glass windows is centrally placed in this pediment, and the brick wall below is lighted with two pairs of six-over-one wood sash windows flanking a central single window.

The western or rear elevation is lighted with corresponding wall dormers with a single six-over-one wood sash window to the north and the entry and another identical single window to the south.

The interior of the church retains all of its original stained glass and dark, stained wood moldings and decorative trusses. Large, ogee arches define the wall openings between interior spaces and the entire ceiling is wood strips, stained a rich, dark color.

The Methodist Episcopal Church, South is virtually unaltered and in excellent condition.

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Significance

Criterion C, statewide significance

The Methodist Episcopal Church, South (Part E, Historic Context #4) is actually part Gothic Revival and part English Revival. The Gothic Revival style, which had become so popular across the United States for Christian ecclesiastical construction, continued to remain so in this sphere of building, and never became unpopular for such until after the arrival in the late 1930's of the International style architects from Europe. Such early twentieth-century high-style architects as Ralph Adams Cram and Charles Maginnes publicly advocated and practiced the use of the Collegiate Gothic well into the 1920's and rural congregations were even more prone to conservative, familiar tendencies. However, it is important to note that the appearance of more decorative, less structural half-timbering and the preference for square-headed windows instead of pointed arch windows heralds the specific arrival of the English Gothic, which relied upon late medieval, vernacular English residences for inspiration rather than medieval churches. The Methodist Episcopal Church, South survives as one of the best ecclesiastical structures in the state designed in what is most commonly called the "Tudor" style.
