Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Tidal School is a two story building constructed of red brick laid in header and stretcher courses with tooled joints. The overall dimensions of the school are 35' x 118'. The roof is gabled and covered with composition shingles. The building includes several features of Georgian Revival architecture including a rectangular plan, a minimum of minor projections, and symmetrical facades. False-end chimneys projecting above the roof line on the east and west ends contribute to the overall symmetry of the building.

The east and west ends of the front facade project slightly and are crowned with pediments without supporting pilasters. Within the projection on the east end is an arched window where the glass panes have been replaced with wood. Below the pediment on the west projection is the archway entrance for the second floor. Within the archway are double doors with molded panels. Between the two projections on the front facade, a series of twelve sash windows, 9 over 9, are located on the second story. On the first floor facade, partially below ground level, a second series of sash windows, 6 over 6, is located. A wooden belfry adorns the central part of the building's roof.

The south facade is similar to the front with the exception that double doors are positioned in the center of the building. The second story contains a series of eight sash windows, 6 over 6. Stairwells below ground level lead to entrance doors for the first floor on both north and south sides of the building.

The east and west facades are identical. The second story has two sash windows, 9 over 9. Directly above these windows are two quarter-round windows with wagon-wheel designs.

A header course of brick is laid on all four sides of the building to denote divisions between floors.

The Tidal School was closed in the early 1950's, however, the City of Drumright still uses the building as a meeting place for local youth and civic organizations.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Tidal School is significant because it is the best example of a "wing school" remaining in the Cushing oil field area and because it was built by the Tidewater Oil Company for the children of their workers. A "wing school" was an outlying school in the rural oil fields surrounding the oil boom towns. This type of school provided vital educational services in an era when many of the town schools could not accommodate the sudden over population of school-age children, therefore, schools were dispersed rather than consolidated. Tidewater Oil Company, a subsidiary of Standard Oil of New Jersey, provided the funds to construct the Tidal School on their lease land where the Tidal Refinery and Camp were located, thus making it a quasi-company school. The Tidal School still plays an important role in the social and educational life of the Drumright community as a meeting place for 4-H Clubs, Future Farmers of America Chapters, and local civic organizations.
