DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Ridgway Building is located at 313-315 Main Street in the heart of downtown Evansville. Formerly a busy thoroughfare, Main Street today is closed to traffic and features planters, trees and fountains. A plexiglas canopy is suspended above the first stories of most buildings the entire length of the walkway.

Although the Ridgway Building's first floor has undergone the same kind of unsympathetic "modernization" as have most others on the street, its round-arched facade above the canopy appears much as it did at the turn of the century. This facade, with its buff brick arches and pale orange terra cotta ornamentation, was probably part of a remodeling project begun, according to building permits, in 1895. A photograph of 315 Main at approximately this time shows a cast iron storefront, part of which is still visible on the alley side. Three and a half stories high, the facade is consistent in scale with the rest of the block. The red brick body of the building has stone sills and lintels, although a later rear addition to the building on the left (315 Main) has segmentally arched windows.

The facade is four bays wide, each arched bay $2\frac{1}{2}$ stories high and separated by buff brick piers. Each pier rests on a terra cotta base and ends with a squarish foliated capital, from which springs the buff brick arch. An unusual feature of these piers and arches is their subtle polychromy with rounded brick edges, giving the entire facade a very smooth, plastic appearance.

Windows are a full bay wide, with doublehung wooden sash. Spandrels are of terra cotta, with small tiles bearing a simple diaper work pattern. This pattern is continued in the spandrels above the terra cotta archivolt. Three brick pilasters — in the center and at each corner — stand the height of the parapet and rest on foliated terra cotta bases that grow from the intersection of the arches. A terra cotta frieze is surmounted by a molded terra cotta cornice and a short brick parapet with terra cotta coping.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

1895

The Ridgway Building is significant as a superior example of late nineteenth century commercial architecture, and one of few on Main Street retaining its early appearance. Its name comes from the Ridgway Optical Company, which has occupied the building since 1922.

The building, actually two buildings with a common wall and facade, was probably built around 1860. Its owners at that time were Frederick W. Brinkmeyer, who operated a foundry and stove works with a salesroom at this location, and Charles Keller, whose gun and sporting goods business operated at this address continuously until circa 1893.

In 1895 building permits were issued for both properties to "add to and remodel store." It is believed that the facade and an addition to the rear of 315 Main were built at this time. The Book of Evansville -- Illustrated, published circa 1896, includes a photograph of 315 Main showing its present facade.

Evansville's Main Street, once lined with rows of elaborate store facades, has been the victim of much remodeling and rebuilding. As on Main Streets everywhere, windows have been altered or bricked in, and architectural details removed or covered by modern materials. The Ridgway Building, however, has survived into the present day with its upper facade nearly intact, and as such stands as a rare reminder of yesterday's Main Street.
