Describe present and historic physical appearance.

The Mary Cochrane Barn is a five pen, cantilevered log and frame barn built ca. 1880. The barn was built in a rectangular plan with the interior divided into five log pen sections which are connected by frame enclosures. The barn has a stone pier foundation and gable roof of metal standing seam. The first story is primarily of log construction with hewn logs displaying adze marks and half-dovetail notching. The log pens also display their original vertical board paneled doors. The upper story is cantilevered approximately three and one-half feet over the first story and has weatherboard siding. The interior framework is of mortise and tenon and pegged construction. Separating the main log pens are runways and each log pen is divided into two stalls. The frame section on the north facade appears to be original to the barn. The barn is located in a rural section of the county near Clover Hill and is surrounded by woods and open fields.

State significance of property, and justify criteria, criteria considerations, and areas and periods of significance noted above.

The Mary Cochrane Barn is significant under criterion C as a representative example of a cantilevered log barn. The barn contains five log pens and is one of only two five-crib barns identified in Blount County. The Mary Cochrane Barn is the least altered of the two and has five lower-level log cribs, a frame loft, side facing gables, and a roof ridge parallel to the front and rear of the structure. The barn continues to be used for hay and silage storage and has not been significantly altered.


