DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Avero House is a two-story rectangular block with an open loggia on the southeast. The walls are of coguina shellstone laid in roughly horizontal courses in lime mortar. They are plastered inside and out. There is one coquina masonry chimney with two flues. Ground floor openings are restorations, with closure by simple wooden shutters or plank doors. The second floor windows are 12 light, double hinge, and appear to be survivals from the first quarter of the 19th The hip roof is covered with cement-asbestos simulated century. wood shakes. The ground floor interior floor plan consists of a large front room, a smaller rear room and a loggia. The second floor is an apartment consisting of a stair hall, five The stair is a straight run from the open rooms and a bath. loggia below to a semi-enclosed stair hall above. The first floor covering is a modern concrete slab, the second floor is wood.

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Although apparently built ca. 1/12, the first detailed information on its general shape does not appear until a map of 1762 shows it to have a <u>U-shaped floor plan</u>. An appraisal in 1763 states that the main portion (on St. George Street) was two-stories high with a flat roof and the L-shaped wing extending to the east was one-story with at least a portion of it shingled. This same general plan extends through a detailed map of 1788, an inventory of 1790 and more detailed appraisal of 1816. Present evidence indicates that the onestoried east wing was demolished around 1900.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The building is one of 30 remaining houses within the historic district that pre-date 1821. Although the above ground portions have been modified extensively (particularly the ground floor street facade), the wealth of documentary evidence would make restoration extremely feasible. Architecturally it is a fine example of the St. Augustine plan as defined by Manucy and would make a valuable addition to the restoration program.

The British Governor Tonyn allowed the house to be used for a period as a "private oratory for the use of the Catholic Minorcans...." This apparently was the first semi-permanent place of worship that the survivors of Turnbull's New Smyrna colony had since migrating to St. Augustine.
