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Description

Commercial buildings of the Railroad Era (1870-1914) mirrored current architectural trends. Builders during this period in White County did not construct many high-style buildings; the Staggs - Huffacker Building is no exception to this.

Located on the south corner of N. Main and W. Illinois Streets, the Staggs - Huffacker Building is located in what was once the economic heart of Beebe. The building is two-stories tall, rectangular in shape with a chamfered corner and a shed roofed addition, and constructed of brick. Even though it was built in c. 1880, it is still in good condition. The storefront windows along Main St. have been replaced by single-pane fixed frame windows.

A wood shingled awning extends the length of the facade on the first floor. Second floor fenestration consists of two-over-two double-hung sash windows which appear to be original. Extending above these windows along the facade and onto the chamfered corner is a corbelled belt course. The flat with parapet roof has a corbelled cornice and a one-bay gabled portion which rises up from the center of main elevation's roof line.

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Significance

When this building was constructed, c. 1880, it was one of numerous businesses located along Main St. This street runs perpendicular to the Missouri-Pacific Railroad tracks and in fact crosses them near the depot. Because of its proximity to this beehive of activity, many businesses located on Main St. Architecturally, the Staggs - Huffacker Building is a good example of buildings constructed during this period. Also, it is one of only eleven relatively unaltered Railroad Era commercial buildings which survives in town.

Throughout the years, this building has housed a variety of businesses on its first and second floors. The ground floor, for example, has played host to a restaurant, stationary store, furniture store, and a dry goods store while the upper floor has been occupied by a furniture store, movie theater, and a hardware and millinery store.

The building was named after Ray Huffacker and his cousin Paul Staggs; they originally operated a hardware store in this building.
